WHEREAS, Section 40001 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California 1 authorizes the Placer County Air Pollution Control District, to adopt and enforce Rules and 2 Regulations to achieve and maintain ambient air quality standards within the District; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Section 40702 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California requires 5 a district to adopt rules and regulations and do such acts as may be necessary or proper to 6 7 execute the powers and duties granted: and 8 WHEREAS, Portions of the Placer County Air Pollution Control District (PCAPCD) have 9 been designated as "serious" non-attainment areas for the federal 8-hour ozone standard 10 11 pursuant to the Federal Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 (FCAA): and 12 WHEREAS, The FCAA requires for non-attainment areas the submittal of Volatile Organic 13 Compounds (VOC) and Nitrogen Oxides (NOx) Reasonably Available Control Technology 14 15 (RACT) rules covering all Major Stationary Sources of VOC or NOx; and 16 WHEREAS, The Board of Directors of the PCAPCD has determined that there are no Major 17 Stationary Sources of VOC or NOx in the District in a source category for which no Control 18 Technology Guideline has been promulgated for which the District does not have an adopted 19 20 rule satisfying RACT requirements (i.e. all Major Sources have RACT compliant rules 21 adopted); and 22 WHEREAS, The Board of Directors of the PCAPCD has determined in the 2006 RACT SIP 23 Update Analysis that the adoption of a negative declaration, stating that the District has no 24

1 existing Major Stationary Sources of VOC or NOx in the District in a source category for

2 which no Control Technology Guideline has been promulgated for which the District does

3 not have an adopted rule satisfying RACT requirements (i.e. all Major Sources have RACT

4 compliant rules adopted), is necessary to comply with Title 1, Part D, Subpart 2, Section

5 182(b)(2) and 182(f) of the 1990 Federal Clean Air Act Amendments for the submittal of

6 Reasonable Available Control Technology (RACT) rules covering all Major Stationary

7 Sources of VOC emissions; and

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9 WHEREAS, these proceedings were held in a public hearing and were properly noticed

pursuant to Section 40725 of the Health and Safety Code of the State of California; with any

evidence having been received concerning the proposed adoption of this Resolution and this

12 Board having duly considered such evidence; and

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14 WHEREAS, the negative declaration findings are categorically exempt from CEQA

pursuant to Title 14, California Administrative Code, Section 15308, as an action by a

regulatory agency for the protection of the environment;

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that this Board approves and adopts this

Negative Declaration certifying that there are no Major Sources of VOC or NOx in the

District in a source category for which no Control Technology Guideline has been

promulgated for which the District does not have an adopted rule satisfying RACT

2	hereby authorized and directed to submit this Negative Declaration as a requested revision to
3	the State Implementation Plan, in the form required by the California Air Resources Board

5	Pollution Control District.
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
