
ADVISORY NOTICE FOR GASOLINE DISPENSING FACILITIES WITH HEALY 900 EVR NOZZLES

This advisory notice is intended for all Gasoline Dispensing Facility Owners/Operators, Contractors, and Parts Houses that operate, install, or sell Healy 900 EVR Nozzles in Placer County.

Recently, the California Air Resources Board (ARB) determined that most Healy 900 nozzles manufactured in 2007 do not meet the same standards as nozzles certified by the ARB for the Phase II EVR Healy system. This puts Franklin Fueling Systems, owner of Healy, in violation of California Health & Safety Code (H&SC) Section 41954(f) and District Rule 214 - Transfer of Gasoline into Vehicle Fuel Tanks which prohibits the sale and installation of uncertified vapor recovery equipment.

The ORVR recognition diaphragm, located at the base of the spout of the Healy 900 nozzle was changed in 2007. The changed diaphragm makes the nozzle uncertified equipment, but also causes the Veeder Root system to note a system malfunction. To rectify this situation, Franklin Fueling Systems has agreed to replace this part in all 2007 Model 900 nozzles in California by April 15, 2008. The model year is contained in the nozzle serial number, located on the bottom of the handgrip of the nozzle, and reads as follows: XX YY Z, where YY indicates the model year (06, 07, and 08).

Any new Healy 900 nozzles installed at any gas station (whether new or existing) in Placer County, must be model year 2006 or 2008 nozzles, or a 2007 Healy 900 nozzle that has been rebuilt with a replacement diaphragm that meets the certification. Selling or installing an uncertified nozzle is a violation of H&SC 41954(f) and District Rule 214 - Transfer of Gasoline into Vehicle Fuel Tanks.



Owners/operators are recommended to contact their distributor, to let them know of any 2007 model year nozzles at their facility, and find out the schedule for replacement. The District also requests notification by station owners, by March 21, 2008 if any of these uncertified nozzles are in operation or have been recently replaced at your facility. Notification can either be by letter, telephone, or by e-mail.
