# YOU could be THE KEY

The WOTC program was created to:

- Help qualified job seekers find jobs.
- Help employers who hire qualified job seekers by offering them a tax credit.

What every employer wants and needs is a dependable person who will do a good job for their company.

If you qualify for one of the WOTC target groups, an employer who hires you may be eligible to receive a federal tax credit of up to \$9,000.

This benefit may give you an advantage over other job seekers competing for the same position.

# How do you qualify for WOTC?

# Timeliness!

If you fit into one of the following Target Groups, you may qualify the employer for the WOTC:

- A.** Qualified recipients of Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF).
- B.** Qualified veterans receiving Food Stamps **OR** A disabled veteran with a 10 percent or higher rating who is hired within one year of discharge date, **OR** has been unemployed six months or more, whether or not consecutive, during the one year period prior to their hire date.
- C.** Ex-felons hired no later than one year after conviction or release from prison for a felony.
- D.** Designated Community Resident, ages 18 through 39 who reside in an Empowerment Zone, Enterprise Community, or Renewal Community.
- E.** Vocational rehabilitation referrals including Ticket Holders.
- F.** Qualified summer youth, ages 16 through 17, who reside in an Empowerment Zone, Enterprise Community, or Renewal Community.
- G.** Qualified Food Stamp recipients who are between the ages 18 to 39 and are a member of a family who have received six consecutive months of food stamps ending on the hire date.
- H.** Qualified recipients of Supplemental Security Income (SSI).
- I.** Long-term family assistance recipients.
- J.** An unemployed Veteran who received a minimum of 4 weeks of Unemployment Insurance benefits in the one year period prior to the hire date AND was discharged from the military within five years of the hire date.
- K.** Disconnected Youth, Age 16 to 24, who during the six month period prior to the hire date, did not regularly attend school or training, was not regularly employed, and who lacks the basic skills to perform the job.

**The Work Opportunity Tax Credit program** is a great marketing tool that jobseekers can use to encourage an employer to hire them!



For employers to apply for certification, two required forms must be completed, mailed, and postmarked **NO LATER THAN THE 28<sup>TH</sup> day after your first day of work.**
