Thank you for providing information for existing conditions. Does the water usage include both residential/commercial and snowmaking? If so can it be segregated out?

Existing water usage is inclusive of commercial and snowmaking. There is no residential existing at Homewood Mountain Resort today. The billing comes as a lump sum and not segregated out between snowmaking and commercial unfortunately.

Are you going to provide this data for Alternative 4, assuming the construction of 16 single family homes at full project buildout?

Will do, but I'd also imagine that you'd have some standards that would apply to single family homes that might be applicable as well. If so, I'd suggest using those bearing in mind that these are likely to be larger homes in the 3500-4000 square foot range.

Do you know the horsepower of the engines for the generators?
