What is this data telling us about achievement of outcomes?

Demographics

A total of 50 children were served. 30 are continuing children and 20 are new from December.

Most of the participating children are Caucasian but there is an increase in diversity from the last reporting service period.

There are some teens from Sacramento who attend the program, but they are not included in the demographics.

Parents

There were a total of 52 parents 5 males and 47 females. The trend for teen pregnancy is younger, but they are not counted as most continuation schools do not allow these teens to attend the program until they are sophomores.

Language is a challenge, but there is some program staff who are proficient in Spanish to address the Hispanic population.

Pre/Post Test Results

21 teen moms completed the pre and post tests, the males did not complete the post test.

Most teens indicate they are more knowledgeable and confident regarding child development, nutrition, safety, and their ability to handle their child's behavior. These teens are asking for help when they need it.

Survey responses indicate the teens are feeling confident and supported. There is a sense of maturity and nurturing in their responses and they also share what they learned with others.

LodeStar data

The data includes 35 parents from First 5 and 143 parents from TAPP only.

Most of the indicators demonstrate that children are healthy and safe and that these teens are getting support.

Anecdotes

Anecdotes demonstrate these teens are getting much needed support and are gaining confidence. There are also important life lessons like communication that are learned and used at home.

In what ways will we apply what we have learned from our data?

Speak to principal or superintendent regarding issues such as classroom availability and supportive policies and procedures.
