
### Door-to-door Flowchart: 2005 - 2006



## Evidence of Transfer of Knowledge

2005-06 parent surveys, completed during follow-up, confirm that 63 parents from 90 families with children 0-5 shared information about community resources with other parents. Parents shared information with relatives, neighbors and friends. The information shared included:

#### Family Success Story

Javier, single father of 1-year-old son, came in to request services after hearing about the Family Resource Center from his aunt. Javier requested health insurance for uninsured son. Services were provided and additional family support services were offered. Javier encouraged son's biological mother, Elena to come in and request family support services. Elena completed intake at FRC and was linked to Hispanic Support Group, AFRC clothes attic and a referral was submitted to Public Health Nurse and Home First.

#### Family Success Story

Sister-in-law drove Raquel, 24-year-old Latina mother of 1-year-old girl and her husband to AFRC for services. Family was linked to AFRC clothes attic, local food banks, employment readiness, and daughter was enrolled in Kaiser Child Health Plan. Family had just arrived from Mexico within the month and was unaware of services available. Raquel stated: "I did not know about the services, and I'm very grateful of the Kaiser, since last month my daughter got sick and I wasn't able to take her to the doctor, because we didn't have jobs or money."
