

Therapeutic Interventions

This workshop covers the types of treatment interventions used with children and their parents.

Topics include

- the concept of “secure attachment” and how attachment is developed
- parents’ emotional availability, defined and assessed
- children's temperament clusters and their effects on parent-child interactions
- the process of play therapy
- use of interpretation within play therapy
- characteristics of post traumatic play
- discipline styles of parents
- behavior-based discipline and its application in conjunction with play therapy
