ACTION REQUESTED

Approve a total appropriation of \$5,750 in District 5 Revenue Sharing Funds (Benefit Grant Funds) to the attached list of nonprofit organizations and events recommended by the Citizens District 5 Benefit Fund Committee: Boys and Girls Club of North Lake Tahoe (\$1,000), Sierra Senior Services Meals on Wheels (\$1,000), Olympic Heritage Celebration (\$750), Foresthill Chamber of Commerce Heritage Celebration (\$250), Foresthill Swim and Recreation Pool Filtration System (\$1,000), Save Auburn Ravine Salmon and Steelhead Education Program (\$750), KidsFirst Education, Information, and Coaching (\$250), Placer Land Trust (\$500), and Auburn Host Lions Club "Ski for Light" (\$250).

BACKGROUND/COMMUNITY BENEFITS:

Supervisor Montgomery directed that a citizens committee be established for the purpose of reviewing and making recommendations on the distribution of revenue sharing funds to various community organizations. The committee has undertaken its evaluation and has come forward with a list of recommendations to your Board from applications received on behalf of various community groups and interests within District 5.

DISTRICT 5 BENEFIT COMMITTEE

Following notices informing the public of the process and seeking interested citizens, the District 5 Benefit Fund Committee was formed. In addition, to assist the committee in its task of review and evaluation, a list of committee procedures and categories of evaluation was developed. Currently, the District 5 Benefit Committee is comprised of six members; Megan Chillemi, Emily Wexler, Wally Reemlin, Ann Brown, Ken Baughman and Bob Houston. Posting of the meeting of the committee occurred at the Placer County Administrative Offices, 175 Fulweiler Avenue, Auburn and on the Supervisor Jennifer Montgomery Event Calendar on the County Website. A meeting was held on Monday, August 24, 2009 at 10:00 a.m. with Megan Chillemi, Wally Reemlin, Anne Brown and Ken Baughman. They voted to recommend the distribution of District 5 Revenue Sharing funds to nine different entities in a total amount of \$5,750.

In approving revenue sharing contributions, the Placer County Board of Supervisors finds that each and every approved contribution serves a public purpose by promoting the general welfare of the County and its inhabitants therefore a benefit results to the County.

Funding from the District 5 Benefit Fund would go directly to supporting the SMART programs at the Boys and Girls Club of North Lake Tahoe. Currently, there are four SMART programs in existence; one each for boys in grades 4-6, boys in grade 7-12, girls in grade 4-6 and girls in grades 7-12. These programs have curriculums that were created by the National Boys and Girls Club headquarters and are used around the country. At the core of the SMART programs is the goal of enriching the lives of our youth by teaching them about the importance of becoming well-rounded individuals, making healthy life-choices, and maintaining positive relationships with their friends, families and community. While individual programs vary due to members' interest and supervisors' assessment of group needs, each SMART club focuses on empowering and encouraging members to develop high self-esteem, display good judgment and act with confidence.

This year, the SMART clubs at the Boys and Girls Club of North Lake Tahoe have held fundraisers in the form of bake sales and dances, gone on field trips to volunteer at Pet Network, swim at the Incline Village Recreation Center and celebrate Earth Day at the Kids for Conservation Expo in Incline Village, and spent afternoons learning about cooking, saving money and dealing with conflict, among other activities. The 4-6 grade SMART Boys and Girls collaborated to put on a "Trashion" show, which was aimed at teaching members to "think outside the box" when it comes to reusing trash. Both of the SMART Girls clubs held sleepovers, where they learned about cooking healthy meals and talked about how to handle difficult social situations that they might encounter at school each day. High-school students in the SMART programs learned from employees of the Bank of America about how to save and budget their money; the same members also talked at length about job opportunities and finding ways to help support their families.

While each group does hold fundraisers, the activities and trips that SMART members participate in require funding beyond what can be raised. Funding would go towards buying supplies for activities within the BGC facilities - poster-making, cooking, basic craft supplies like tape and scissors and snacks for meetings - as well as transportation and admission for our off-site trips. In the future, we hope to be able to go on more trips, for example to museums and on hikes, which would require funding beyond our current means.

Dear Ms Montgomery,

Thank you in advance for the opportunity to present a request for funding for Sierra Senior Services. We are dedicated to improving the lives of seniors in the North Lake Tahoe and Truckee area through our senior nutrition program. We offer a community dining room experience Monday through Friday in Truckee along with three different routes for the Meals-on-Wheels program which serves homebound seniors meals 7 days a week. The service area in Placer County extends to Donner Summit down to the North Shore including Kings Beach and Tahoe City. Our agency is struggling to keep up with the increased demand for services in our area. More than 23,000 meals were served this past year with approximately 8,500 going directly to Placer County residents.

Our request pertains to the need for additional supplies to continue delivering meals. We have specific hot bags that are used Monday through Friday on the Meals-on-Wheels routes. I am including a bid submitted to our program last month to replace outdated equipment. We also need to purchase additional Techni Ice packets for the coolers to keep milk and salads cold. Our current hot bags will not hold proper temperatures for the upcoming winter months.

As previously stated, demand keeps increasing and we are doing everything in our power to continue meeting the increased need for our services. One fact that most people do not know about our agency is that we offer this service at no cost to the participant, donations are accepted but nobody eligible for the program over the age of 60 is ever turned away from a meal due to lack of ability to contribute to the program.

Thank you again for your consideration. I look forward to hearing from you in the near future.







Mission Statement: to return salmon and steelhead to the entire length of the Auburn Ravine

RE: District 5 BENEFIT FUND

Dear District 5 Benefit Fund Committee,

SARSAS (Save Auburn Ravine Salmon and Steelhead) Inc. is overseen by 9 member board of directors that includes 4 members who live inside District 5. The projects we are asking you to consider funding will benefit children and adults in the 5th District.

I have provided along with the application and this letter a copy curriculum for the "Calling Back Wild Salmon" school program for fourth and fifth Graders. We will bring Eric and Paula Peach of Auburn to District 5 schools with a project that is well received by students in the Auburn area especially at Skyridge Elementary. The Peaches teach a unit on the life cycle of salmon, and then students glaze ceramic salmon ocarinas (flutes), which are then kiln fired. Each student learns to play a song on the instrument they have created and the class performs the tune together combining art, music, fishery conservation and biology education while having fun together.

Benefits to the Community: Awareness of the anadromous fishes in our watershed will help our goal of increasing the populations of salmon and steelhead in Auburn Ravine.

Expected Start and Completion Dates: Fall 2009

The purpose of SARSAS is to provide passage and adequate water in one stream, the Auburn Ravine, so that salmon and steelhead can establish a strong run in Placer County. Our further goal is to spread this work to all streams in California on the model we create here and on the work which has already been done successfully on Butte Creek near Chico. A part of what SARSAS does is promoting awareness of, and solutions to, the crisis in the Pacific Morine Fishery. SARSAS would like to bring this program to Sierra Hills, Weimar hills or other 5th District schools.
