SUBJECT: Approve the Award of Competitive Request for Qualifications No. 10133 and for Wastewater and Water/Recycling Systems; Facility Permitting/Regulatory Compliance; Water Quality Monitoring; and Landfill Consulting and Gas Collection Services for Facility Projects and Adopt Multiple Lists of Qualified Firms

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve the award of competitive Request for Qualifications No. 10133 for Wastewater and Water/Recycling Systems; Facility Permitting/Regulatory Compliance; Water Quality Monitoring; and Landfill Consulting and Gas Collection Services for facility projects and adopt multiple lists of qualified firms, effective for a three-year period.

BACKGROUND

On behalf of the Department of Facility Services (DFS), the Procurement Services Division requested sealed Statements of Qualifications (SOQ) from one hundred and fifty-four firms and posted RFQ 10133 on the County's website to establish multiple new lists of qualified firms to provide a variety of engineering related services on an as-needed basis. Each approved list will be responsible for one area of service as noted in the specific sections below. Formal responses were received from thirty-six firms.

The evaluation panel rated the responses in accordance with the evaluation criteria contained in the RFQ. The final lists are the result of the panel's composite ranking after discussion, and are based on a natural break occurring between the overall scores of the firms. The lists shown are based strictly on the requirements and criteria of RFQ 10133 and do not in any way reflect the County's judgment of the responding firms' capabilities to perform work outside of this specific RFQ.
