ACTION REQUESTED

Approve a Resolution commending Roseville High School on its 100th Anniversary.

BACKGROUND/COMMUNITY BENEFITS

In 1912, Roseville High School was established with a handful of students that met in abandoned hotel and theater buildings. Within 4 years, in 1916, Roseville High School became a highly reputable, fully accredited high school housed in a fine, modern building and grew to several hundred students attending.

In June of 1913, two students graduated from Roseville High School and in 2012, 100 years later, 450 students graduated from Roseville High School. That number of graduating seniors represents only one high school out of five high schools that now make up the Roseville High School Unified School District.

Roseville High School has produced many notable Alumni, from Olympians to the film industry, sports figures, actresses, and musicians. Roseville High School also produces teachers/educators, health care workers, and computer technology careers, industries that represent the most jobs in Placer County.

Roseville High School serves grades 9 - 12 in the Roseville Joint Union High School District, and is among the few public high schools in California to receive a distinguished Great Schools Rating.

The "High School on the Hill" has served as the primary facility for the high school touting over 19,900 Graduates.

WHEREAS, Roseville High School also produces teachers/educators, health care workers, and computer technology careers; and

WHEREAS, Roseville High School serves grades 9 - 12 in the Roseville Joint Union High School District, and is among the few public high schools in California to receive a distinguished Great Schools Rating; and
