**SUBJECT:** Contract with First 5 Placer Children and Families Commission

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**ACTION REQUESTED:**

Approve a contract with the First 5 Placer Children and Families Commission for Adolescent Family Life Program support services from July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013 in the amount of \$75,000, and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to sign the contract and subsequent amendments. (No net County cost.)

**BACKGROUND:**

Placer County's Adolescent and Family Life Program (AFLP) has provided services to 1,456 Placer County pregnant and parenting adolescents since 1985. Through comprehensive case management, Public Health staff assess and address the risks and resources of adolescent clients and their children. By promoting the health and well-being of these adolescents, problems associated with preterm births and low birth weight such as cerebral palsy, mental retardation, diabetes, and high blood pressure are reduced. Last year, 95 percent of teens served delivered full-term babies. In addition, long-term State and County welfare dependency resulting from school failure and dropouts is minimized. Last year, of those teens who completed high school, 60 percent were enrolled in postsecondary education and 40 percent were employed.

The First 5 Placer Children and Families Commission, whose vision includes *creating an environment that supports our children and their families in reaching their full potential*, has awarded AFLP a \$75,000 grant for Fiscal Year 2012-13. This award helps to offset a loss of prior funding, including Federal pass-through funds, enabling AFLP to continue with the same level of service it has provided adolescents in previous years. First 5 and AFLP share a common goal of supporting teen parents in Placer County to be confident and competent in their parenting skills and to develop plans for the future. Fiscally, the \$75,000 grant from First 5 will result in a dollar for dollar match from Federal funds.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

The maximum amount of this contract is \$75,000. No County General Fund match is required. These funds are included in the Department's FY 2012-13 Final Budget.
