SUBJECT: Call the following elections and authorize the County Clerk to render election services for the November 7, 2006 Gubernatorial General Election

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the attached resolution authorizing the County Clerk to render election services for the elections to be held November 7, 2006.

BACKGROUND

Pursuant to federal and state law and the Placer County charter, certain federal, state, and county elections are to be conducted by this office on the first Tuesday in November each even-numbered year. Election Code Section 10002 and Education Code Section 5303 also provide that special district and school Governing Bodies may request the Board of Supervisors to order their elections and permit the County Clerk to render necessary election services to said Bodies on a reimbursable basis. For the County Clerk to perform the functions pursuant to Election Code Section 10002 and Education Code 5303, the County Clerk needs approval of this resolution from the Board of Supervisors.

Please see attached 'Exhibit A' for a list of jurisdictions seeking election and requested ballot measures.

FISCAL IMPACT

Requesting jurisdictions will pay for these special elections based on the approved fee schedule for election services.

MEASURE J Yuba Community College District

To repair/upgrade Yuba and Woodland Community Colleges, improve job training, university transfer, provide more courses to students close to home, repair/expand classrooms for math, science, healthcare, nursing, police, fire, public safety programs, upgrade electrical, heating, ventilation systems, repair leaky roofs, improve disabled

access, upgrade technology, repair, construct, acquire, equip buildings, classrooms, sites, computer labs, shall Yuba Community College District issue \$190 million in bonds, at legal rates, with mandatory audits and citizen oversight to monitor spending?

MEASURE K Alta Dutch Flat School

Shall the Alta-Dutch Flat Union School District collect \$52 per year per taxable parcel for four years beginning July 1, 2007, in order to continue educational programs by providing support for instructional classroom staff, classroom supplies/materials, and site maintenance, with citizen oversight and exemptions for taxpayers aged 65 and older.

MEASURE L Sacramento Municipal Utility District

Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD) provide electric service to the Cities of West Sacramento, Davis and Woodland and portions of Yolo county by annexation; on condition that Yolo customers shall pay the costs of annexation and service and the SMUD Board of Directors shall use any net income from Yolo service to maintain low rates through debt reduction, and invest in energy efficiency and clean energy resources for use in the Sacramento region?"

MEASURE M Loomis Union School District

"To improve education quality throughout the District, shall the Loomis Union School District modernize student facilities, upgrade safety systems, enhance technology, construct gymnasiums/multi-purpose rooms, provide improved access for disabled persons, relocate/centralize student support services facilities, enhance physical education facilities, and provide additional classrooms by issuing \$19,500,000 of bonds at an interest rate not to exceed the statutory limit, with a citizens' oversight committee, independent audits, and no money for salaries?"
