**Subject: Out-of-State Travel for the Public Safety SCUBA Training Course**

**ACTION REQUESTED**

Your Board is requested to approve the out-of-state travel for ten days for Deputy Michael Powers to travel to Del Ray Beach, Florida as required for Public Safety SCUBA train-the-trainer instruction as part of his position on the Dive Team. Your approval of the travel and training costs estimated at 3,990 is required per the Administrative Rules.

**BACKGROUND**

Placer County Sheriff's Department has a dive team both in North Lake Tahoe and Auburn Operations. We do not currently have a certified dive instructor on the dive teams. Both teams currently rely heavily on outside vendors to provide basic training for new divers and re-certification. The course cost alone per diver is \$365 plus any travel and meal expenses. Scheduling is often an issue in coordinating initial and ongoing training. A public safety SCUBA instructor (PSSI) certification would fill a current void within our teams. It would also provide future savings in training costs by having a certified instructor on-staff.

Public safety training and requirements are more demanding than recreational. Having an instructor on-staff would insure all training and dive operations were in compliance with National Public Safety Diver (PSD) standards. This would in turn reduce our liability issues and risk of accident. This also provides consistency of training and standards throughout our organization. There is overwhelming evidence of serious safety concerns when relying on recreational training for basic dive certification for public safety dive teams.

Dive Rescue International is the organization that conducts these courses. They are the most recognized organization in public safety diving in the United States. They currently train to the standards used by Placer County. They are only offering this course one time this year at one location – Del Ray, Florida. It is a ten day, nine night travel at an overall estimated expense of \$3,990. Your Board's approval of this travel is required.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

The cost of this travel and training of \$3,990 is included in the Sheriff's Budget. No additional funds are being requested. We currently have three divers that need to be PSD certification. \$1,095 in savings will be realized immediately upon the successful completion of this course by training and certifying these staff. Future savings resulting from new team members filling vacant spots and requiring certification will quickly offset the cost of this training. In addition, the reduction of risk and liability from more standardized training geared toward public safety divers is another value and offset to the cost of this training.

Please find attached a training request from Deputy Michael Powers. At the present time, neither the Tahoe Station nor the Auburn Dive team has a Public Safety Diver Instructor qualified member. Both teams have to rely on outside vendors to provide basic training for new divers at substantial cost to the County in terms of both time and money. At this time any recognized, industry standard Rescue Diver training program will cost at least \$350.00, plus equipment, food, and lodging to train a single diver. To train an instructor will cost \$1,250.00 plus expenses. Once that instructor has trained four Deputies "in-house" that cost will have been realized. That instructor will then also be able to re-certify any qualified divers on the team at no cost to the County, saving further costs.

Having an instructor level Team member will also protect the County from liability related costs that might be incurred due to injury or accident. His knowledge and skills will enhance the safety and abilities of other Team members, help protect the public, and deliver a higher level of service during both training and SAR operations.

At this time, there are no training programs by any recognized Public Safety Diver training companies at a closer location being offered. It is my intention to continue to pursue other types of training by hosting other courses, but as there is no need for multiple PSD instructors, this is not a viable option for this particular course.

As can be seen from the attached memorandum from Deputy Powers, he is a highly motivated, intelligent and well informed Deputy. He is in the early stages of his career, and as such will be a part of the Team well into the foreseeable future, and represents the future health of the Sheriff's Department Search and Rescue efforts. He is one of the two strongest divers on the Team and I feel represents an excellent investment for the Dive team and the Sheriff's Department as a whole. I strongly recommend and request that you approve this training request.

I am writing this memo in regards to the attached request for training. I am requesting the opportunity to be certified as a Public Safety SCUBA Instructor. Public safety diving is an inherently dangerous assignment. On average, two to three public safety divers die each year in the U.S. There are many more reported incidents of accidents, which either resulted in serious injury, or had the potential to. In some cases the divers were medically retired from their agencies due to their injuries. In an analysis of these accidents, 86% were a result of improper training or unfamiliarity with equipment. ([www.diverescueintl.com](http://www.diverescueintl.com)). A Public Safety SCUBA Instructor (PSSI) certification would fill a current void on our team and would cost effectively develop certified Public Safety Divers (PSD). This would allow an instructor to be able to standardize and certify non-divers and open-water divers as a PSD. This insures all training and dive operations are in compliance with national Public Safety Diver standards; thereby reducing Department liability and more importantly reduce the risk of an accident.

Managing risk includes mandatory continuing education and skills documentation programs. By developing and documenting training consistent with national standards, we insure that all of our divers have the training and skills required to perform the challenging assignments we are tasked with. We must have a systematic approach to managing the risk our divers face every time they are underwater, weather it's for training or on an operational basis. If specific procedures aren't implemented, the potential for disaster is imminent. There is overwhelming documentation that provides evidence of serious safety concerns when relying solely on recreational training for public safety dive teams. Recreational divers are not performing dives in zero visibility, dives with prolonged bottom times, dives with entanglement hazards, dives requiring heavy physical exertion, dives involving evidence collection/documentation, or dives at all time of the day and night in extreme weather conditions ([http://firechief.com/mag/firefighting\\_watery\\_saves/index.html](http://firechief.com/mag/firefighting_watery_saves/index.html)). Proper training can eliminate many of these risks and help our divers maintain a professional and effective team.

Dive Rescue International is the organization conducting these courses. It is, by far, the most recognized organization in Public Safety diving in the United States. Their curriculum and support materials have been the standard our team has used successfully in the past. Currently, their 2007 training calendar only has one instructor course for the year, with no evidence of any additional courses for the year.

In addition to the increased safety and professional appearance of the Dive Team, a monetary savings to the Sheriff's Dept and the County is immediately recognizable and dramatic. The cost of the instructor course, along with the prerequisite Medical Dive certification, is \$1200.00.

MEMO

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The cost for a single student to certify as a Public Safety Diver outside the department is \$365.00. Multiply this cost by the three non PSD certified members on the team, include the vacant positions on the team for future divers and factor in the tremendous turnover rate at the Tahoe Station and the cost savings becomes quite evident; and this is not factoring in the expense of housing, travel, and meals to send each new diver to become independently certified. By comparison, the cost for one person to attend the course in Florida is minimal.

Having an instructor on the team would save Placer County money, increase our professional appearance, drastically reduce civil liability in the event of an accident, and most importantly, help prevent a tragedy. I am willing to take on this responsibility, and help maintain the standard of excellence our team has always aspired to achieve.




