**SUBJECT:** Call the February 5, 2008 Presidential Primary Election and Authorize the County Clerk-Recorder-Registrar of Voters to Render Election Services for Certain Special District, School District and City Elections Requested to be Combined with the February 5, 2008 Election

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**RECOMMENDATION**

Approve the attached resolution calling the February 5, 2008 Presidential Primary Election and authorizing the Placer County Clerk-Recorder-Registrar of Voters to render election services for certain special district, school district and city elections that are requested to be combined with the February 5, 2008 election.

**BACKGROUND**

Pursuant to California Election Code Sections 1000 and 1202, the 2008 Presidential Primary Election shall be held on February 5, 2008. As your Board is aware, the February date was added to provide for an earlier Presidential Primary Election in California. State and local elections may be held in conjunction with this earlier Presidential Primary election.

Election Code Section 10002 and Education Code Section 5303 provide that city, special district and school governing boards may request the Board of Supervisors to order elections on behalf of their local agencies and permit the County elections official, which in Placer County is the County Clerk-Recorder-Registrar of Voters, to render necessary election services to said jurisdictions on a reimbursable basis.

**ISSUE STATEMENT**

Approval from the Board of Supervisors is required for the County Clerk-Recorder-Registrar of Voters to perform requested election functions on behalf of special districts, school district, and cities.

'Exhibit A' of the attached resolution contains a list of local jurisdictions seeking elections, and the requested ballot measures, which would be combined with the February 5, 2008 Presidential Primary Election in Placer County.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

Requesting jurisdictions will pay for the requested special elections that are to be combined with the February 5, 2008 Presidential Primary Election based on the approved fee schedule for election services as set forth in the County Code.

**WHEREAS**, the State of California has pursuant to Section 1000(e) of the California Elections Code ordered the 2008 Presidential Primary Election to be held on February 5, 2008; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Sections 1002 and 10002 of the Elections Code and Section 5303 of the Education Code, the governing bodies of cities, special districts and school districts may request the Board of Supervisors to call local agency elections on an established election date and permit the County elections official to render specified services to said local agencies relating to the conduct of elections on a reimbursable basis; and

**WHEREAS**, the governing bodies of certain local jurisdictions within the County of Placer have requested that elections for the consideration of specific measures be combined with the Presidential Primary Election on February 5, 2008, and that the Placer County-Recorder-Registrar of Voters be permitted to render election services to said local agencies on a reimbursable basis;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the following Federal, State, County, City, Special District and School District Elections be held:

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Supervisors of the County of Placer hereby authorizes the Placer County Clerk-Recorder-Registrar of Voters to render and be reimbursed for any and all necessary election services for the conduct of said elections.

Measure E Dry Creek Joint Elementary School District

(Shared with Sacramento County. Placer is lead County)

To improve the quality of our local elementary and middle schools, modernize classroom technology, construct new science and computer labs, improve school security, build new schools and classrooms and become eligible for millions in additional state school construction grants, shall the Dry Creek Joint Elementary School District issue \$67.3 million in bonds at lawful interest rates with all expenditures audited and reviewed by a citizens' oversight committee, and providing no money for administrator salaries?

Measure F South Placer Fire Protection District

(Placer County only.)

Shall Ordinance No. 2007/2008 – 4 which authorized the South Placer Fire Protection District to exceed the appropriations limitation imposed by Article XIII B of the California Constitution, if necessary, for four years beginning with the July 1, 2008, to June 30, 2009, fiscal year, be approved?

Measure G Loomis Union School District

(Placer County only.)

THE LOOMIS UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT CLASSROOM REPAIR AND CONSTRUCTION MEASURE: To improve child safety and classroom learning environments by renovating our schools, including: removing asbestos and lead, upgrading faulty old fire safety equipment, electrical and plumbing systems and bathrooms, repairing leaky roofs, upgrading technology infrastructure, building two new multi-purpose rooms, and making schools legally handicap accessible, shall the District issue \$17,700,000 in bonds, requiring citizens' oversight, annual independent audits, with no money for administrators' salaries?

Measure H    City of Rocklin

(Placer County only.)

Shall Resolution No. 2007-245 previously passed by the City Council approving a General Plan Amendment reducing allowed acreage for residential development of Clover Valley from 504 to 199 acres, and increasing the acres designated for open space from 70 to 366 acres, and reconfiguring Valley View Parkway from a 4-lane facility to a 2-lane facility be adopted?

Measure J    City of Rocklin

(Placer County only.)

To continue current efforts to keep park and recreation facilities safe, clean and well maintained, shall Rocklin City Ordinance No. 926 be approved which would allow the City to continue to collect a per parcel fee; such fee would be between \$10.00 and \$45.00 per year, adjusted annually for inflation, for a period of fifteen years to be used only for park maintenance and development?
