ACTION REQUESTED

Approve a total appropriation of \$8,500 in District 5 Revenue Sharing Funds (Benefit Grant Funds) to the attached list of nonprofit organizations and events recommended by the Citizens District 5 Benefit Fund Committee. North Tahoe Family Resource Center (\$500), North Tahoe Business Association (\$1000), Auburn Aviation Association (\$500), West Shore Business Association (\$500), Auburn Host Lions Club (\$1000), Placer Nature Center (\$1000), Olympic Heritage Celebration Committee (\$1000), Iowa Hill Volunteer Fire (\$1000), Foresthill Chamber of Commerce (\$500), Foresthill High School (\$500) and Colfax High School Sober Grad Night (\$1000).

BACKGROUND/COMMUNITY BENEFITS:

Supervisor Kranz directed that a citizens committee be established for the purpose of reviewing and making recommendations on the distribution of revenue sharing funds to various community organizations. The committee has undertaken its fourth evaluation and has come forward with a list of recommendations to your Board from applications received on behalf of various community groups and interests within District 5.

DISTRICT 5 BENEFIT COMMITTEE

Following notices and publicity informing the public of the process and seeking interested citizens, the District 5 Benefit Fund Committee was formed. In addition, to assist the committee in its task of review and evaluation, a list of committee procedures and categories of evaluation was developed. Currently, the District 5 Benefit Committee is comprised of five members; Russell Poulson, Stephanie Perry, Megan Chillemi, Ken Baughman and Wally Reemlin. Posting of the fourth meeting of the committee occurred at the Placer County Administrative Offices, 175 Fulweiler Avenue, Auburn and on the Supervisor Bruce Kranz Event Calendar on the County Website. A teleconference meeting was held on Monday, May 5, 2008 at 10:30 a.m. with members constituting a quorum and at that time, they voted to recommend the distribution of District 5 Revenue Sharing funds to eleven different entities in a total amount of \$8,500.

In approving revenue sharing contributions, the Placer County Board of Supervisors finds that each and every approved contribution serves a public purpose by promoting the general welfare of the County and its inhabitants therefore a benefit results to the County.

The people of the Kings Beach and Tahoe Vista communities are facing the exciting but daunting task of responding to a number of significant development and redevelopment proposals. These proposals include the Kings Beach Core Improvement Project focusing on Kings Beach's main street, Highway 28. Several Kings Beach proposals are included in the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency's Community Enhancement Program featuring new developments and revitalized businesses along with workforce housing. Tahoe Vista also has several proposals in various stages of the planning and approval process.

The intent of the Neighborhood Coalition is to educate the people of our communities about how and when they can participate in the complex series of community meetings, governmental hearings, and other forums in the years ahead. Placer Nature Center respectfully requests Revenue Sharing Funds for 2008 for two important improvements at our education campus:

1) To reconstruct our amphitheater stage. We use the stage and seating area for public and students' events and activities during our summer day camp. While Eagle Scouts have reconstructed the seating area, installed solar powered lighting and landscaping, the stage itself is still **inadequate - primarily because the "roof" is so low.** This building was originally constructed for the Department of Fish and Game and sheltered animals injured by cars or hunters. The roof is so low that our presenters (bat educators, Wild Things, speakers on various environmental topics, Docent/teachers) cannot comfortably use the stage.

If we were to raise the roof approximately 5 feet - it would be a vast improvement - providing both shade, shelter, acoustic enhancement and focal point for our presenters. We estimate the cost of this project at \$6,500. An Eagle Scout is interested in doing the construction. A contribution of \$1000 toward this project will be appreciated. Any donation over \$1000 or above will be recognized on our Giving Tree Community Donation Recognition wall.

2) To create a terrace/patio outside of our Exhibit Hall entry door. Our Exhibit Hall is enjoyed by 9,000 students and their teachers annually. It sits in a lovely courtyard that is covered in mulch and forest litter. While the natural "look" is pleasing, it is very messy. Rain or shine - students tromp into the Exhibit Hall, carrying mud, leaves and dust with them. This makes maintaining our carpets a constant challenge. We would like to lay flagstone or simulated rock at the entry points to the Exhibit Hall to

reduce the dirt and litter that is carried into the building. If you could provide funds to purchase the materials - rock/simulated rock, sand and header boards, we will have volunteers install a 250 square ft. patio/terrace. We estimate the cost of this project at \$800.

The amphitheater and terrace projects are needed to better serve community members who come to the Center for recreation and information. We serve over 10,000 community members each year. As you know, Placer Nature Center is a 501 c. 3 organization that offers a myriad of opportunities for nature investigation and discovery. We would like to utilize Revenue Sharing funds to enrich the experience of visitors to the Center.

Placer Nature Center is primarily staffed by volunteers who donate their time to lead school children through science learning and nature hikes as a part of their school field trips. Placer Nature Center is located in the 5th Supervisorial District. We hope that your support will allow us to expeditiously complete these improvements. We hope to have the in place for our busy summer camp season.




