SUBJECT: REVENUE SHARING – Approve a total appropriation of \$4,000 in District 5 Revenue Sharing Funds (Benefit Grant Funds) to the attached list of nonprofit organizations and events recommended by the Citizens District 5 Benefit Fund Committee. Placer Union High School District Falcon Foundation (\$1,000), Foresthill Trails Foundation (\$1,000), West Shore Association (\$1,000), and Friends of Kings Beach Library (\$1,000).

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve a total appropriation of \$4,000 in District 5 Revenue Sharing Funds (Benefit Grant Funds) to the attached list of nonprofit organizations and events recommended by the Citizens District 5 Benefit Fund Committee. Placer Union High School District Falcon Foundation (\$1,000), Foresthill Trails Foundation (\$1,000), West Shore Association (\$1,000), and Friends of Kings Beach Library (\$1,000).

BACKGROUND/COMMUNITY BENEFITS:

Supervisor Kranz directed that a citizens committee be established for the purpose of reviewing and making recommendations on the distribution of revenue sharing funds to various community organizations. The committee has undertaken its evaluation and has come forward with a list of recommendations to your Board from applications received on behalf of various community groups and interests within District 5.

DISTRICT 5 BENEFIT COMMITTEE

Following notices and publicity informing the public of the process and seeking interested citizens, the District 5 Benefit Fund Committee was formed. In addition, to assist the committee in its task of review and evaluation, a list of committee procedures and categories of evaluation was developed. Currently, the District 5 Benefit Committee is comprised of five members; Russell Poulson, Stephanie Perry, Megan Chillemi, Ken Baughman and Wally Reemlin. Posting of the meeting of the committee occurred at the Placer County Administrative Offices, 175 Fulweiler Avenue, Auburn and on the Supervisor Bruce Kranz Event Calendar on the County Website. A

teleconference meeting was held on Monday, October 6, 2008 at 10:30 a.m. with members constituting a quorum and at that time, they voted to recommend the distribution of District 5 Revenue Sharing funds to four different entities in a total amount of \$4,000.

In approving revenue sharing contributions, the Placer County Board of Supervisors finds that each and every approved contribution serves a public purpose by promoting the general welfare of the County and its inhabitants therefore a benefit results to the County.

I have enclosed an application for a \$1,000 grant from your benefit fund. You may remember, when I visited your office in June, you encouraged me to submit this application for the Colfax High School all-weather track project. As a long-time resident of the City of Colfax and a former student and teacher at Colfax High School, I have a long relationship with the track. As both an athlete in high school and a coach early in my teaching career, I experienced much frustration over the poor drainage and extended drying time that characterized this facility.

Over a year ago, we began a local effort to raise some money with the hope of finally bringing an all-weather track to Colfax High. The other schools in our District (Foresthill, Placer, and Del Oro) already have such surfaces. The reason this is such a great addition to Colfax goes far beyond the fact that students will be able to use it year-round in their P.E. classes. Sporting teams will be able to improve their overall fitness level by training on the facility. The Colfax community has long come out to Marson Field and exercised after work; this new facility will be available to them year round. The facility will also be useful for the Colfax Elementary School, located on an adjoining parcel of property. In recent years, due to the untimely occurrence of spring rains, both the high school and elementary school have been forced to host their home meets at Placer High School or another such venue.

The Foresthill Trails Alliance (FTA) has been working closely with the County Department of Facility Services to maintain and improve the Todd Valley Trail, a County trail extending through the middle of Todd Valley, near Foresthill, CA. Primary County contacts have been Tim Stoffeth and Tim Ardent of Parks and Grounds.

The project has been broken into three phases. Phase I was completed in 2006 using County provided materials and FTA member labor. Due to cut backs in state funding, the County was not able to provide materials to work Phase II. The WSA will provide each participating business with a dedicated rubber stamp and instruction sheets to be circulated to all employees. Each business is totally responsible for their event and stamping visitors passports to qualify for awards.


