ACTION REQUESTED

BACKGROUND/COMMUNITY BENEFITS:

Supervisor Montgomery directed that a citizens committee be established for the purpose of reviewing and making recommendations on the distribution of revenue sharing funds to various community organizations. The committee has undertaken its evaluation and has come forward with a list of recommendations to your Board from applications received on behalf of various community groups and interests within District 5.

DISTRICT 5 BENEFIT COMMITTEE

Following notices and publicity informing the public of the process and seeking interested citizens, the District 5 Benefit Fund Committee was formed. In addition, to assist the committee in its task of review and evaluation, a list of committee procedures and categories of evaluation was developed. Currently, the District 5 Benefit Committee is comprised of five members; Megan Chillemi, Emily Wexler, Wally Reemlin, Ann Brown and Bob Houston. Posting of the meeting of the committee occurred at the Placer County Administrative Offices, 175 Fulweiler Avenue, Auburn and on the Supervisor Jennifer Montgomery Event Calendar on the County Website. A meeting was held on Friday, May 1, 2009 at 10:00 a.m. with all members present. They voted to recommend the distribution of District 5 Revenue Sharing funds to thirteen different entities in a total amount of \$9,530.

In approving revenue sharing contributions, the Placer County Board of Supervisors finds that each and every approved contribution serves a public purpose by promoting the general welfare of the County and its inhabitants therefore a benefit results to the County.



The Tahoe Truckee Community Scholarship Committee was established in 1970 by a group of concerned educators within the Tahoe Truckee Unified School District. The purpose was to enable graduating seniors enter higher education. Last year the Committee was able to award over \$90,000 in scholarships to graduating seniors of the Tahoe Truckee Unified School District. Funds for scholarships are provided by community based organizations, foundations, and individuals. All of the contributors feel that providing a means for youth to pursue a higher education is absolutely critical to the success of these students and the Country as a whole. It is recognized that not all students are well served by college; therefore vocational education is also eligible for funding.

The Committee has developed a very comprehensive application process, an extremely blind and objective rating process for the students, and complete documentation by the school attended by the student is required before any funds are dispersed. The whole process is the total responsibility of the student. We consider this an important part of the learning process.

Contributors are able to stipulate the parameters for the award of funds. Typical parameters are need, course of study, vocational education, and merit. If the contributor's criteria cannot be met, the contributor is notified and given the opportunity to have the Committee make the award to a qualified graduate or retain the funds for the following year. This provision has made the Committee more successful in attracting funds from community organizations.

Every year the Committee encounters many qualified students who do not see how they can possibly pursue a higher education based on the cost. In many cases the grants made by the Committee enable the graduate to enter college. Once on campus, they are in a great position to seek further financial aid and campus jobs which enable them to continue. We consider this a very important aspect of the scholarship program. We realize that the longer graduates wait to pursue college, the less chance they have to succeed or even enter college.

The goal of the event is to provide a fun, safe, supervised and sober graduation celebration for all Foresthill graduating seniors and their guest from 9:00 p.m until approximately 2:00 a.m. the following morning. We are anticipating attendance of approximately 60 students and guests. We plan to offer fun activities such as dancing, casino games, Rock Band, and raffle prizes - an enticement that gets more kids involved.

As you well know, public schools in California have taken an \$8 billion hit with budget crisis. Over 26,000 teachers will receive "pink slips" because of the State's financial melt down. . . . Enrichment programs - that feature so critically in a child's development are being cut. . . . among those cuts - field trips for students to Placer Nature Center. We would like you to dedicate Revenue Sharing Funds to two projects that will ensure that 8,000 children (annually) will continue to receive quality science enrichment lessons at Placer Nature Center. 

SARSAS (Save Auburn Ravine Salmon and Steelhead) Inc. is overseen by a board of directors that includes 4 members who live inside District 5. The two projects we are asking you to consider funding will benefit children and adults in the 5th District.

I have provided along with the application and this letter a copy of a booklet titled "Salmonid Savers". During the dozens of public outreach events SARSAS has attended we have given away nearly 500 of these booklets to teachers and students. The book provides games that teach the life-cycle and challenges to success that salmon and steelhead go through in their amazing journey from river to sea and back to the river again. This cycle that has been taking place for thousands of years is under severe stress from human actions. The purpose of SARSAS is to provide passage and adequate water in one stream, the Auburn Ravine, so that salmon and steelhead can establish a strong run in Placer County. Our further goal is to spread this work to all streams in California on the model we create here and on the work which has already been done successfully on Butte Creek near Chico. A part of what SARSAS does is promoting awareness of, and solutions to, the crisis in the Pacific Marine Fishery and the use of the Salmonid Saver booklet helps enormously. The River Teachers who may be contacted via www.yubariver.net/content/river-teachers, use this booklet in conjunction with their school programs about salmon. SARSAS would like to bring these programs to Sierra Hills, Weimar hills and other 5th District schools.

The booklet is currently in short supply and we request your committee recommend to the BOS that they approve funding \$500.00 to print more of the "Salmonid Savers" booklets.

The second request for funding is for a feasibility study looking at creating fish passage in the reach of the Auburn Ravine from PG&E's Wise Powerhouse in Ophir to the Auburn School Park Preserve behind City Hall in Auburn. Three of the SARSAS board members met with Tom Plummer of Civil Solutions at their Lincoln office on April 14th and I have included with this application the initial proposal from Civil Solutions and another firm for this feasibility study. The two firms are working together on a proposal for a pre-feasibility study that will first look at just the issue of fish passage before expanding the study to include all the aspects of the stream restoration that would eventually be needed. The estimated cost of this pre-feasibility study will be \$30,000.00 and we will raise that money from a number of smaller donors. The full study will be funded by grants applied for via our membership in the CABY IRWMP. You can find out more about CABY by visiting www.cabyregion.org

The Friends of Auburn/Tahoe Vista Placer County Animal Shelters is a local non-profit organization dedicated to improving the lives of animals. We would very much appreciate your consideration for an award from the discretionary Revenue Sharing funds available for the quarter.

Our shelter facility at the DeWitt center and our network of foster homes have been serving hundreds of animals over the past ten years. On an ongoing basis, we incur significant expenses related to veterinary care, medicine, food and supplies. We have always met our financial obligations through continuous fund-raising and modest adoption charges. However, in the past eight months our costs of operation have greatly increased and contributions have dropped off significantly. The cost increases are due to the need to pay rent, electric and gas bills. Prior to October 2008 these costs were subsidized.

We are asking for a grant of \$1000 to go toward our utilities (garbage, gas and electric bills) for the quarter. Our dumpster service costs us \$165 per call. Our facility was built in the 1940s and is not significantly insulated or weather-stripped. Because we house animals 24/7 and volunteers need to work comfortably, either our heating or our air conditioning is almost always on; the cost for this is usually more than \$300 per month. If we are fortunate enough to have temperate weather in the coming quarter and not expend the full amount, we would very much appreciate being able to use the funds as a contribution toward our cat food cost.

The Cat House primarily benefits cats who the County was no longer able to provide for due to space considerations. We think you will also want to know that it benefit's a community of volunteers who take pride in helping animals. Our volunteers are serving the community in a way that suits them and deriving a great deal of joy from interacting with the animals and knowing they are comfortable. Dear Mr. Kranz and District 5 Benefit Fund Committee,

For 37 years Foothill Volunteer Center, now Seniors First has been the leader in providing support services for the senior population in our community.

With the growth of the senior population in Placer County we have a challenge to provide critical services to the seniors needing our supportive services.

According to census figures in 1990 the number of 60+ seniors in Placer County was 28,000. In 2000 the number grew to 42,000. Census indicators show that in 2010 that number will rise to an estimated 82,000.

We have to prepare now to support the continual increase of Placer County seniors and provide those services that maintain their health and independence.

We are asking for your support of our Senior Nutrition Program. With our Nutrition Program many seniors are referred by health care professionals, concerned family or friends or the senior themselves concern about their nutrition.

Nutrition is an ongoing issue for seniors, as most cannot cook a nutritious, well balanced meal for themselves. Our meals provide 1/3 of the RDA (recommended daily allowance) of nutrients needed for good health. We currently provide a hot noon meal to 225 homebound seniors and 200 seniors eat at one of our nine senior cafes Monday thru Friday. All home delivered meals are delivered by volunteer drivers.

Some are not aware that Seniors First is a non-profit organization, not a Government Agency. Your support will help us to continue to provide the critical services needed by the Seniors of Placer County. Services which allow them to remain independent and in their own homes for as long as possible.
