BACKGROUND/COMMUNITY BENEFITS: In approving the following contributions, the Placer County Board of Supervisors finds that each and every approved contribution serves a public purpose by promoting the general welfare of the County and its inhabitants therefore a benefit results to the County.

The Board of Supervisors is being asked to approve appropriations to help support the Placer County Museum Docent Guild *Heritage Trail 2009 Event*. The Heritage Trail event is a trail ride between Roseville and Tahoe City with stops at all of the museums along the way. The participating museums are located in Lincoln, Roseville, Rocklin, Penryn, Auburn, Foresthill, Colfax, Dutch Flat and Tahoe City. Visitors from the Sacramento Region as well as the Bay Area will enjoy the rich history and agricultural history that Placer County has to offer. The funds designated towards this popular event will help defray the cost of the event.

The Placer County Museums Docent Guild, a non-profit 501c3, respectfully requests your financial help for the community event, HERITAGE TRAIL to be held on August 8th and 9th of 2009.

Last year was the first HERITAGE TRAIL weekend and it was a huge success. The HERITAGE TRAIL is similar to a trail ride between Roseville and Tahoe City with stops at all of the museums along the way. Eighteen museums in Placer County participated last year and we are anticipating three new museums for 2009.

Last year we had visitors from all over the Sacramento Region as well as a good number of Bay Area visitors. The rich history of Placer County represents an excellent subject to support expanded tourism for the entire county. This year there will be an added agricultural history element to broaden and stimulate visitation. We even offer a bus tour for visitors who do not want to drive their cars between museums. Last year the bus proved to be very popular and sold out early.

The participating museums are located in Lincoln, Roseville, Rocklin, Penryn, Auburn, Foresthill, Colfax, Dutch Flat and Tahoe City.

We are asking for funds to cover event promotion and printing costs of the ten-page map and trail guide, which provides driving instructions and descriptions of the museums on the HERITAGE TRAIL.


