

RE: Public Hearing to Review and Approve an Ordinance Amendment for several Probation Department Fees

ACTION REQUESTED:

It is requested that your Board take the following actions:

1. Conduct a public hearing to consider a Fee Ordinance adjustment,
2. Adopt an Ordinance to amend Section 40 of Article 2.124 of Chapter 2 of the Placer County Code (Section 2.124.040), Fees for Criminal Justice Services relating to Probation Department Fees.

BACKGROUND:

The Probation Department has a variety of fees established for services rendered to the public. Some of these fees are required to be established by county ordinance. The fees were reviewed pursuant to County Code 2.124.040, which generally requires that fees not exceed the actual cost of services or the average actual cost of services. The services provided that are in need of adjustment range from the sealment of juvenile records, to processing a change of plea report, to the daily fee for participation in the Work Release Alternative Sentencing Program, and the daily fee for care and maintenance of minor's while detained in the Juvenile Detention Facility. These fees have been adjusted to reflect actual costs related to the materials and labor to provide the listed services, to process the services and to account for recent legislation allowing for the increase of these fees (SB676).

Attached is Probation's proposed changes to its' fees and the resultant changes to the ordinance related to Probation's Criminal Justice fees. Increases now reflect those rates as allowed by law and substantiated by the actual costs to perform the tasks associated with the fee processed. Note that in relation to Criminal Justice fees, defendants, probationers, or inmates, generally cannot be denied services if they do not possess the required resources. In the cases where this applies, the County has a payment reduction process based on the individual's ability to pay. This process impacts the amount of money the County is able to collect for these fees. Additionally, AB3000 dictates how monies collected are distributed so that fines are paid first. Monies collected for fees are applied thereafter.

Your Board is requested to conduct a public hearing to provide the public the opportunity to comment regarding these fee adjustments. Based on your review and comments heard, we are requesting your Board approved the fee ordinance adjustments as submitted.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The fiscal impact to increased fees is variable and depends on volume and services requested. We conservatively estimate revenues, pursuant to this action, to increase by approximately \$65,000 to \$85,000. This amount has not been included in the Proposed Budget submitted to your Board for FY 10/11. If approved, these changes will be reflected in the Final Budget for FY 10/11. No additional budget adjustments are requested.

**THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF PLACER, STATE OF CALIFORNIA
DOES HEREBY ORDAIN as follows:**

Section One. Article 2.124, Section 2.124.040 of Chapter 2 of the Placer County Code is hereby amended as shown:

2.124.040 Probation department fees.

C. Change of plea fee ¹	\$120.00 \$150.00
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L. Juvenile records sealing ¹	\$120.00 \$150.00
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S. Work Release Fee: ¹	
1. Application/reapplication fee	\$ 25.00
2. Per day	\$40.00 \$20.00

U. Juvenile Detention Facility care and maintenance	\$30.00 per day
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1. This fee is subject to the ability to pay, the fee charged shall not exceed the maximum amount stated.

Section Two. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect thirty (30) days after its adoption. The Clerk is directed to publish this ordinance or a summary therefore, within fifteen (15) days in accordance with Government Code Section 25124.
