**SUBJECT:** Approve Resolution Authorizing the County Registrar of Voters to Render Election Services for the November 2, 2010 General Election

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**RECOMMENDATION**

Approve the attached resolution authorizing the County Clerk-Recorder-Registrar of Voters to render election services for local agencies in conjunction with the November 2, 2010 General Election.

**BACKGROUND**

Pursuant to federal and state law and the Placer County Charter, certain federal, state, and county elections are to be conducted by this office on the first Tuesday in November each even-numbered year. Elections Code Section 10002 and Education Code Section 5303 also provide that special district and school governing bodies may request the Board of Supervisors to order their elections and permit the County Clerk-Recorder-Registrar of Voters to render necessary election services to districts on a reimbursable basis. For the County Registrar of Voters to perform these functions pursuant to Elections Code Section 10002 and Education Code 5303, approval is needed from the Board of Supervisors.

Please see attached 'Exhibit A' for a list of jurisdictions seeking elections at the November 2, 2010 General Election and requested ballot measures.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

Requesting jurisdictions will pay for their elections that are consolidated with the Nov. 2, 2010 General Election based on the approved fee schedule for election services. In addition, the State reimburses the County for vote-by-mail (absentee) ballot costs. The General Fund is responsible for the remaining net cost of federal, state election contests and any countywide races or measures, and adequate funds are appropriated in the FY 2010-11 County Budget for conducting the Nov. 2, 2010 General Election.

## LIST OF MEASURES SCHEDULED FOR ELECTION

**Measure A – Town of Loomis**  
**Requires a simple majority to pass.**  
**(Placer County only)**

Shall the proposed ordinance entitled “An Initiative of the Loomis Town Citizens Enacting Term Limits” which provides:” (1) five council members serve 4-year terms; (2) terms shall be staggered; (3) no member can serve more than two consecutive 4-year terms; (4) a member who has served two terms prior to August 1, 2010 must sit out eight years; and (5) current members can complete their terms, be adopted?

**Measure B – City of Roseville**  
**Requires a simple majority to pass.**  
**(Placer County only)**

Shall the City Charter be amended: (1) Out-of-date provisions: sections 1.055, 2.06, 2.07, 2.10, 2.12, 2.13, 3.02, 3.03, 4.02, 4.05, 5.03; (2) Up-dated provisions: sections: 2.14, 3.09, 8.02, 8.03, 8.04, 8.05, 8.07, 9.01; (3) Typographical corrections: sections 4.06, 6.01; (4) Minor procedural changes: sections 1.05, 2.04, 2.09; (5) Capitalizing the word City, replacing the word member with councilmember, and adding the word City to all named officials?

**Measure C – City of Roseville**  
**Requires a simple majority to pass.**  
**(Placer County only)**

Shall the City Charter be amended as follows: (1) Section 2.02, providing that a partial City Council term served due to appointment to a vacant council seat does not count as a term for the purposes of this section; and (2) consecutive four (4) year terms; and (2) Section 2.05, changing title of mayor pro tempore to vice mayor?

**Measure D – City of Roseville**  
**Requires a simple majority to pass.**  
**(Placer County only)**

Shall the City Charter be amended as follows: (1) Section 2.03, modifying the time frame for assumption of office by, and seating of, elected councilmembers, to conform to California Elections Code §15372?

**Measure E – City of Roseville**  
**Requires a simple majority to pass.**  
**(Placer County only)**

Shall the City Charter be amended with respect to minor fiscal matters as follows: (1) Section 7.09 and 7.10, updating Charter to conform to changes in state tax and assessment law beginning with the passage of Proposition 13 in 1978; (2) Section 7.095 deleting and reserving section; (3) Minor procedural and typographical amendments: sections 7.05, 7.06, 7.15, 7.19 and 7.20?

**Measure F – City of Roseville**  
**Requires a simple majority to pass.**  
**(Placer County only)**

Shall the City Charter be amended with regard to certain fiscal matters as follows: (1) Section 7.21, allowing adoption of an ordinance establishing bidding preference for businesses located within the City of Roseville?

**Measure G – City of Roseville**  
**Requires a simple majority to pass.**  
**(Placer County only)**

Shall the City Charter be amended with regard to certain fiscal matters as follows: (1) Section 7.21, increasing dollar amount of items requiring a sealed bid from \$10,000 to \$19,500?

**Measure H – City of Roseville**  
**Requires a simple majority to pass.**  
**(Placer County only)**

Shall the City Charter be amended as follows: (1) Section 2.02, providing that term limits be modified from two (2) consecutive four (4) year terms to three (3) terms of four (4) years each, such that a person would be ineligible to hold office after serving on the Council for three (3) four (4) year terms?

**Measure J – Western Placer Unified School District**

**Requires 55% voter approval to pass.**

**(Placer County only)**

To help protect local schools from state budget cuts, improve the quality of education at all our local schools, modernize classroom technology and job training programs, construct new science and computer labs, improve school safety, build new classrooms and become eligible for millions in additional state school construction grants, shall the Western Placer Unified School District issue \$163 million in bonds at lawful interest rates with citizens' oversight and no money for administrator salaries?

**Measure K – City of Lincoln**

**Requires simple majority to pass.**

**(Placer County only)**

Temporary City of Lincoln Essential City Services Protection Measure. To help maintain and protect Lincoln's financial viability and essential services including 9-1-1 emergency/medical response times, helping prevent cuts to police officers, firefighters, library and recreation services, shall the City of Lincoln establish a temporary 3.75% utility users tax ordinance that expires in 4 years, with annual independent audits, public expenditure reports, citizens oversight, low-income senior exemptions, with all revenue dedicated solely for Lincoln and not the State?

**Measure L – Auburn Union School District**

**Requires 2/3 voter approval to pass.**

**(Placer County only)**

To preserve quality education, protect schools from state budget cuts and provide stable funding that cannot be taken by the state to preserve reading, math and science instruction; maintain hands-on science programs, classes and labs; maintain reading and language programs for all students; and attract and retain qualified teachers, shall Auburn Union School District levy \$59 per parcel annually for 5 years with an exemption for seniors, independent oversight and no money for administrators' salaries?
