**SUBJECT:** El Dorado County - Local Enforcement Agency Agreement

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**ACTION REQUESTED:**

Approve an agreement with the County of El Dorado for Placer County Environmental Health to provide continued Local Enforcement Agency services from July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2013 in a total amount not to exceed \$368,775.

Revenues of \$122,925 are included in the Department's FY 2010-11 CEO Recommended Budget. The balance will be included in the subsequent years' budgets. No County General Fund match is required.

**BACKGROUND:**

Placer County Health and Human Services has provided Solid Waste Local Enforcement Agency services to El Dorado County since 1995.

State law provides for local jurisdictions to directly provide or contract for solid waste enforcement activities instead of having CalRecycle, formerly the California Integrated Waste Management Board, provide those services. To meet this requirement, El Dorado County contracts with Placer County to provide state mandated Environmental Health enforcement activities. The types of services provided include inspections, enforcement and permitting of closed, active and illegal solid waste facilities, and preparation of all the associated paperwork for these activities. El Dorado County currently has 23 solid waste facilities. One Registered Environmental Health Specialist is dedicated to conduct these activities.

This agreement provides for full reimbursement of costs incurred by Placer County Environmental Health in providing Local Enforcement Agency services for El Dorado County. The agreement was approved by the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors at their July 27, 2010 meeting.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

Revenues of \$122,925 are included in the Department's FY 2010-11 CEO Recommended Budget. The balance will be included in the subsequent years' budgets. No County General Fund match is required.
