**THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF PLACER, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DOES
HEREBY ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:**

That Placer County Code, Chapter 3, Section 3.12.030 is hereby amended as shown on the attached:

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3.12.030 Unclassified service—Salary and benefits notations.

*2. Physicians are eligible to receive the following additional compensation:

Twenty (20) percent pay differential if the incumbent has one or more board certifications as recognized by the American Board of Medical Specialties, or an affiliated Board, and the California Medical Board in a specialty or specialties that are relevant to the provision of county medical/psychiatric services.

Five (5) percent pay differential if the incumbent is eligible for one or more board certifications as recognized by the American Board of Medical Specialties, or an affiliated Board, and the California Medical Board in a specialty or specialties that are relevant to the provision of county medical/psychiatric services.

Fifteen (15) percent pay differential for forensic pathology specialization in addition to that stated above.

Five (5) percent pay differential for the chief physician for supervision of the child psychiatrist(s).

Physicians hired as psychiatrists shall be eligible to receive either of the following compensation in addition to what is listed above.

Fifteen (15) percent pay differential for psychiatrist specialization, or

Or

Thirty (30) percent pay differential for child psychiatrist specialization.

Subject: Adoption of an Ordinance Updating the Compensation Differential for Forensic Pathology to Comply with CalPERS Regulations

ACTION REQUESTED

Your Board is requested to approve the attached ordinance updating Chapter 3, Section 3.12.030 to include the compensation differential for the Forensic Pathology specialization. This update reflects the differential previously approved by your Board for the forensic pathology contract and is to comply with the CalPERS Regulations. There is no fiscal impact.

BACKGROUND

The California Public Employees Retirement System (CalPERS) governs the manner and types of compensation that are reported to CalPERS for earnings and service credit for types of compensation and actuarial determinations. As part of these regulations, CalPERS requires the adoption of salary ordinances by the governing legislative body to identify the types of pay employees receive. Your Board has contracted since 2002 with Dr. Donald Henrikson for forensic pathology services. His contract includes a forensic pathology specialty differential pay. In compliance with the CalPERS rules and regulations, the forensic pathology pay differential included in the contract requires the adoption of a salary ordinance. This ordinance update reflects the additional compensation differential for the Forensic Pathologist that your Board approved on June 22, 2010. By adopting this ordinance update, there is no change in any of the costs associated with Dr. Henrikson's contract.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact. The proposed ordinance is cost neutral in that it adopts the forensic pathology differential already included in the contract but does not change the pay rate or any terms in the approved contract.

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
