SUBJECT: Approve the Award of Multiple Blanket Purchase Orders Resulting From a Competitively Bid Public Agency Cooperative Agreement with Pro Tech Monitoring Inc., and G4S Justice Services Inc. for Various Electronic Monitoring Equipment and Services in the Maximum Aggregate Amount of \$440,000.00

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve the award of multiple Blanket Purchase Orders (BPOs) resulting from a competitively bid public agency cooperative agreement with Pro Tech Monitoring Inc. of Odessa, Florida, and G4S Justice Services Inc. of Rancho Santa Margarita, California, for various electronic monitoring equipment and services in the maximum aggregate amount of \$440,000.00, and authorize the Purchasing Manager to sign the resulting BPOs.

BACKGROUND

The Probation Department has requested to renew BP017393 with Pro Tech Monitoring Inc. for remote satellite tracking and monitoring of low to medium risk offenders. SB 959 allows Courts to impose mandatory Electronic Monitoring Program (EMP) sentences, and Proposition 83 requires monitoring of sex offenders and sexually violent predators. The Probation Department estimates that two hundred twenty-five to two hundred seventy-five offenders will require monitoring under these programs throughout the renewal period.

The Probation Department has also requested that a new BPO be awarded to G4S Justice Services Inc. for electronic alcohol monitoring equipment and services to monitor felony offenders. SB 678 provides state funding to California counties to invest in evidence-based practices in an effort to reduce California's felony probation failure rate. The electronic alcohol monitoring program will be used as an intermediate sanction to better monitor offenders in lieu of jail time. The Probation Department estimates that seventy-five offenders will require monitoring under these programs throughout 2011.

The remote satellite tracking services and electronic alcohol monitoring services are available to the County via the Western States Contracting Alliance (WSCA) Contract No. 14600, which was competitively awarded by the State of Washington on January 1, 2002 and is in effect through January 1, 2012. Purchasing Policy Manual, Section 1.3(e)(3) permits contracting with a vendor that was awarded an agreement by another public agency as the result of a competitive process without further competitive bidding by Placer County. The WSCA contract meets this criterion.

FISCAL IMPACT

Upon your Board's approval, BPOs will be awarded to Pro Tech Monitoring Inc. in the maximum amount of \$325,000.00 and to G4S Justice Services Inc. in the maximum amount of \$115,000.00, and will be effective January 1, 2011 through December 31, 2011. Probation's Fiscal Impact Statement is attached.
