Subject: Placer Regional Auto Theft Task Force Annual Report

Action Requested

Review the Placer Regional Auto Theft Task Force (PRATTF) Annual Report established pursuant to Vehicle Code (VC) 9250.14. Revenues received in support of the Task Force, plus interest earned for FY 2014-15 totaled \$377,150.

Background

On March 20, 2007, your Board adopted Resolution # 2007-79 authorizing the collection of one dollar (\$1) for vehicles and two dollars (\$2) for commercial vehicles registered annually in Placer County pursuant to VC 9250.14 for vehicle theft deterrence, investigation and prosecution. Annual financial and activity reports are required to be submitted to the County Board of Supervisors and the State Controller's Office.

The Placer County Regional Auto Theft Task Force was created to investigate, apprehend suspects, and reduce vehicle theft and related crimes within Placer County through aggressive, innovative and proactive enforcement measures. The Task Force consists of one California Highway Patrol (CHP) Sergeant, one CHP Officer, one Deputy Sheriff, and one Police Officer each from the cities of Roseville and Rocklin. Funds from VC 9250.14 are distributed to pay for the Task Force's operational and equipment costs, as well as salaries and benefits of city and county staff, and overtime costs of CHP staff. The National Insurance Crime Bureau (NICB) participates by providing vehicles to be used in Task Force operations.

In FY 2014-15, the Task Force made 50 auto theft related arrests and recovered vehicles with values totaling \$1,004,650. The presence of a Regional Task Force has a significant influence on the overall insurance rates determined for County residents.

Fiscal Impact

Funds from this program are included in the Sheriff's Office FY 2015-16 Final Budget. There is no impact to the General Fund.



Pursuant to Vehicle Code (VC) section 9250.14, every county that has authorized the collection of the fee pursuant to subdivision (a) shall issue a fiscal year-end report to the California State Controller on or before August 31 of each year, summarizing the following seven items with respect to those fees. VC section 9250(h) provides that if any county fails to submit the report by November 30, the Controller shall notify the Department of Motor Vehicles to suspend the fee for that county for one year.
