

WHEREAS, the State of California Department of Transportation and the County of Placer, both provide snow removal services on their respective roadways for the traveling public;

WHEREAS, an existing 0.3-mile section of Highway 89 in Tahoe City will be relinquished to Placer County following construction of the Fanny Bridge / State Route 89 Community Revitalization Project; and

WHEREAS, the aforementioned relinquished roadway will be in close proximity to state highways for which Caltrans provides snow removal services, it makes sense from work and resource efficiency perspectives to have one agency take on snow management of the new roadway network resulting from the project including the new Highway 89

section, renamed Highway 28 section, refurbished Highway 89 section to be owned and maintained by the county, and the three roundabouts that will connect these roadways.

BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors, County of Placer, State of California, The Placer County Board of Supervisors does hereby approve this Resolution authorizing the Director of Public Works and Facilities, or designee, to execute a Standard Agreement for Miscellaneous Reimbursed Work with the State of California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) for the Fanny Bridge / State Route 89 Community Revitalization project that will allow Caltrans to provide snow removal services on a 0.3-mile section of State Route 89 once it is relinquished to Placer County. The county will compensate Caltrans up to a maximum annual amount of \$25,000 for these services.
