PLACER COUNTY AIR POLLUTION CONTROL DISTRICT TECHNOLOGY ASSESSMENT PROGRAM

The Placer County Air Pollution Control District Board of Directors has established a Technology Assessment Program (TAP) to provide financial assistance in the form of grants for the development and evaluation of technologies which have the potential to reduce air pollution in Placer County. The program's intent is to provide grant funding for studies and other analysis that would help to assess the emissions effects of projects and to foster projects that may result in emission reductions in future years. The emphasis is on projects that have the potential to reduce criteria pollutants and/or greenhouse gases from stationary sources and transportation.

Applicants for the TAP should prepare and submit a proposal discussing the proposed project. The proposal should include, as a minimum, the following elements:

Introduction summarizing the proposed project

Detailed description of the technology or idea to be evaluated for potential emission reductions

Current state of emissions without use of the proposed technology or idea

Projected emission reductions provided by the proposed technology or idea

Cost estimate of employing the proposed technology or idea

Schedule estimate of when the proposed technology could be available for use

Proposed Statement of Work for the project, including

Description of the various work elements

Schedule of the various work elements

Identification of any partners or subcontractors in the project

Proposed meetings or progress reports with/to the District

Contents of the final report documenting the results of the project

Cost Proposal, including

Requested amount of grant funds

Cost for any subcontractors

Cost share potential by applicant or partners

Cost of any materials required by the project

The District anticipates issuing a firm, fixed price contract to successful applicants to conduct the project according to the Statement of Work. The District may negotiate the details of the Statement of Work with the applicant prior to issuing the contract.

The District awards contracts for TAP at the District's sole discretion, schedule, and availability of funds
