WEST PLACER MUNICIPAL ADVISORY COUNCIL

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Wednesday, June 8, 2011

A informal regular meeting of the West Placer Municipal Advisory Council was held on Wednesday, June 8, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. at the Creekview Ranch Middle School, Roseville, Ca.

- 1. Call to Order: Member Walt Wyllie called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and informed those in attendance that due to lack of quorum this would be an informal meeting and no action would be taken. Items 3, 4, 9, and 11 will be postponed to a future meeting.
- 2. Roll Call: Council members present: Walt Wyllie.

- 3. Pledge of Allegiance: Walt Wyllie let the pledge
- 4. Approval of the Minutes of April 13, 2011. No action taken
- 5. Approval of the Agenda: No action taken
- 6. Public Comment: Noe Fierros asked if the commercial vehicle parking on Crowder could be looked into again and possibly a sign posted. Ken Grehm volunteered to look in to the sign issue and CHP Officer Lyndon would address it from a traffic issue violation. Noe also asked about the vegetation mowing on Crowder which the neighbors used to do until Sun Valley Oaks subdivision was put in which changed the slopes on the banks. The County stated at the time they would care for it so it is in need of clean-up. Noe indicated that if the ditch were changed (not so deep) he would mow it again.
- 7. Supervisor Report: Supervisor Duran reported that he had spoken with City of Roseville officials earlier in the month and the utility right of way issue is now resolved for Cook Riolo Bridge replacement project. .

8. Public Safety:

- A. County Sheriff's Department. Officer Bell reported that the far west end of the community is being hit with copper theft and also some backflow valve theft.
- B. Cal-Fire: Chief Lopez reportes that summer is finally here and they will be beginning their defencivable space inspections and letters for the disk program have been mailed to large property owners. Also a reminder that there are no fireworks allowed in unincorporated Placer County. Also the extension to Station 100 should begin in July. This is to facilitate housing the new water tender.
- C. CHP: Officer Wayne Lyndon reported that there will be a "cell phone/texting" push on Baseline and in our area to ticket violators. Also there will be the speed trailer placed sometime soon in the future Cook Riolo, PFE, and Walerga. Chuck informed the officer of the excessive speed on Vineyard...

9. Action Items:

a) Recommendation to Planning Commission and Board of supervisors to Adopt the Dry Creek Greenway Regional Vision and Certify the final EIR (10 min) Presented by Christopher Schmidt (Planning Dept). To provide a continuous and coordinated system of preserved lands and habitat, with a connecting corridor of walking, equestrian, and bicycle trails, from the Sacramento border to Dry Creek's sources, and to the Folsom Lake State Recreation Area. Postponed

10. Informational/Workshop Items (non-action):

A. Discussion of 2010 Census and how it affects District Supervisorial Boundaries. (20 min) Presented by Kelly Berger (Community Development/Resource Agency): Mr. Berger gave an overview of the population change in Placer County from 2000 to 2010. There has been a 40% increase located mainly in the south Placer areas of the County. This requires a look at evening up the supervisorial districts and he presented 5 different mappings (also available on the web site). The new district maps will be looked and approved prior to Nov. 1, 2011 as required by law.

- B. Cook Riolo Bridge Overview (15 min) Presented by Kellen Prindiville, Public Works) to provide results from the May workshop and how the project is moving forward. Kellen presented an overview of the workshop held on May 23. She stated the new bridge will be 350 ft. long, 52 ft. wide, with 2 12 foot driving lanes and a 10 ft. walking/bike path. As previous stated the right of ways have all been obtained and the application for construction funding can now be put in line at Cal-Trans. The aesthetics option chosen for the bridge is Trans80 (which has a stone look with bars horizontal for creek observation). The existing trusses were discussed but the cost of salvage/repair was too high and did not meet necessary standards.
- C. Dry Creek CP Update (15 mins) Presented by Ken Grehm (Public Works) to provide results from April MAC meeting workshop and how transportation element revisions are moving forward. Ken Grehm gave and overview of the April presentation and the concerns and information they gathered from that workshop. The major concern was the widening of Walerga to 6 lanes and he made it quite clear that this is a plan for the future which would not be starting soon. The community plan allows for options and preserves the right of ways and allows for the collection of impact fees upon future development if in 15-30 years the need is there. He also proposed to place language into the Transportation Element that would require (as is law) a CEQA take place if in fact a perceived need

comes about. This language would place the widening in to the category of a project while the Transportation Element is now a plan. There was a much clearer understanding of the issues now and the Transportation Element will now proceed to the Board of Supervisors for approval.
