### WEST PLACER MUNICIPAL ADVISORY COUNCIL

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Wednesday, February 19, 2014

A regular meeting of the West Placer Municipal Advisory Council was held on Wednesday, February 19, 2014 at 7:00 p.m. at the Creekview Ranch Middle School, Roseville, Ca.

1. Call to Order: the meeting was called to order at 7:04

2. Pledge of Allegiance: John Hottle led the pledge.
3. Approval of the Agenda: Walt Wyllie moved and Alicia Butler seconded a motion to approve the agenda as provided. Motion carried 3-0.
4. Approval of the Minutes of August 14, 2013: Alicia Butler moved to approve the minutes of August 14, 2013 noting the minutes of Sept. 2013 and Jan. 2014 were informal therefore no approval is needed. Walt seconded. Motion carried 3-0
5. Public comment: Any member of the public may address the Municipal Advisory Council on any matter that is NOT listed on the agenda. Comments will normally be limited to three (3) minutes per person at the discretion of the Chairperson. Several community members expressed dissatisfaction with the speed humps on Cook Riolo Rd. sighting the height and lack of clear markings on the speed hump itself. Cristina will relay this information to the appropriate department. Some Morgan Greens residents asked about the street light at the entrance to their subdivision stating it does not work even after people work on it. They indicated the County should take care of this. There was discussion as to who owned/operated the light the HOA or the County and whether the service was from PG&E or Smud. Cristina will look into this.
6. Supervisor Report: Cristina Rivera reported the bridge at Cook Riolo was nearly complete with slight finishing touches being done but it is currently functioning as a 2-lane/walking bridge and lights have been removed. There will be a grand opening sometime in the near future.
7. . Public Safety:
  - A. County Sheriff's Department: Lynn Harrison reported the arrest in Roseville in two separate incidents of men who arranged meetings with 13 year olds and urged supervision of minors on the internet. There have been 7 attempts of burglary in Morgan Creek and Morgan Greens all in open garages. She was excited to announce that for the 5<sup>th</sup> year in a row Placer County has placed (12<sup>th</sup>) in the National Night Out best for the entire nation. We look forward to the 1<sup>st</sup> Tuesday in Aug. for another National Night Out event in our community.

8. Informational Item:

A. Important information on the drought and its implications for Roseville and Placer County. The Placer County Water Agency (PCWA) will provide an update on the current drought and the potential impacts to customers. Presented by Einer Maisch, Director of Strategic Affairs for the Placer County Water Agency and Gray Allen, district 1, Placer County Water Agency Director. Mr. Allan introduced himself as well as Einer Maisch who proceeded with the presentation. Einer gave an overview of the history of water rights in California/Arizona dating back to 1908 and the Owens Valley project (now a desert) forward with the California Aqueduct project in the 1960's to the current proposed Bay/Delta project. Currently the Castaic and Pyramid reservoirs in southern California are 104% capacity while Folsom is 17%, Shasta 35% and Oroville at 54%. It is the feeling of PCWA that northern California water rights have been violated (guaranteed under Term 14 in state water law) PCWA believes a sound water operating plan for the entire State should be developed prior to any placement of Bay/Delta tunnels. The proposed tunnels are to move water to the south from the north with the objective to solve the rising sea level problems so the fresh water and sea water do not blend at the pumping station. (Sea level has risen 10" in 100 years) Related to current water issues many agencies will be asking for reductions in usage up to 50% although there is indication that the ground water (wells) has actually risen since the late 80's due to an aggressive ground water management plan jointly put in place by local water agencies.
