



MINUTES FOR JUNE 19, 2006

1. CALL TO ORDER & INTRODUCTION OF MEMBERS;

Chairman Fowler called the 124th Lincoln Rural MAC meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE was led by Don Chandler.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

As the May 15, 2006 meeting was an informal, informational-only meeting due to lack of a quorum, minutes of 4/17 were not approved at that meeting.

5. PUBLIC COMMENT:

Mr. Chandler reported he had seen many PCTPA flyers discarded at the local post office. Mr. Bostick noted he had filed a complaint with the USPS regarding problems with a pancake breakfast mailing. Ms. Bachman reported some local residents had built motorcycle tracks on their property, resulting in loud noise and dust and she questioned abatement measures. Following discussion, Mr. Fowler noted a county representative might be able to attend a MAC meeting to offer suggestions. Mr. Bostick distributed copies of a response from the county regarding efforts to install new stream and precipitation gauges in Markham and Auburn Ravine watersheds which were impacted by new urban development.

6. PUBLIC SAFETY and COMMUNITY REPORTS:

A. Fire Department:

Dan Rabe noted the Volunteer Appreciation Dinner has been rescheduled to 6/23 at 6:30 p.m. There have been a few wildfires locally and the burn ban is expected to go into effect 7/1. He reminded residents fireworks are banned in unincorporated areas.

B. Placer County Sheriff:

Jim Hudson reminded residents to lock diesel and gas tanks on their property as there have been several thefts lately. Regarding the motorcycle noise reported by Ms. Bachman, he noted there is a county noise ordinance in effect, but encouraged neighbors to work with each other to settle issues. Concerning problems at the cliff area at Camp Far West Lake, he noted the county has posted the area and the property owner has installed fencing and a gate, and filed a letter with the county to that effect.

C. California Highway Patrol:

Mark Williams reported four fatal accidents in northern Placer County since the last meeting. He reported CHP manpower is down about 22%, and year-to-date accidents are down 7%. "Zero Tolerance" will take place 6/30 on Highway 80. Nicolaus Road is now open, with bridge replacement work almost completed. A "Kids Safety Fair" will be held 6/27 at McBean Park from 8:00 a.m.-Noon. Several Sleep Train Amphitheater concerts will be held this summer, including an all-day "OzFest" on 7/2. Regarding the Highway 65 safety campaign, CHP is awaiting response from CalTrans regarding addition of "Mandatory" to the daylight headlight zone signs, as compliance has been poor.

7. INFORMATION/NON-ACTION ITEMS:

A. Former Titan 1-A Missile Facility Project

Brenda Pedersen, US Army Corps of Engineers, offered a power point presentation regarding the former Titan 1-A missile facility near Oak Tree Lane and Highway 193, one of three former Northern California sites. Following approximately eleven years of drilling, sampling and evaluation for TCE contamination, the corps has written a Record of Decision, declaring the site risk manageable. The corps expects to remove wells following a request by St. Joseph Catholic Church, currently being built near the site. She also noted this FUDS site was also used by Placer County as a vehicle maintenance yard for approximately 40 years.

B. Renaming of Highway 65 (portions that fall within the county area)

As CalTrans wishes to offer the bid package this summer for the Highway 65 Bypass Project with construction to hopefully start next summer, portions of Highway 65 that will be relinquished to the city of Lincoln and the Placer County will need to be renamed. Rick Eiri, Placer County Engineering & Surveying Department, noted the city may select "Lincoln Boulevard" for the portions within the city limits. Suggestions for the portions of Highway 65 relinquished to the county include "Sheridan-Lincoln Boulevard", with the Industrial/Athens portion possibly "N. Lincoln Blvd." and "S. Lincoln Blvd." Mr. Eiri noted a meeting is scheduled with the city on 6/22 and he expects to return to the MAC with an update in the near future.
