1. **Called to Order and Introduction of Members at 7:01 p.m.**
2. **Pledge of Allegiance** lead by Supervisor Robert Weygandt

Supervisor Robert Weygandt presented Karla McAnally with a plaque of Appreciation for her many years that she have served on the Rural Lincoln MAC. The November meeting was Karla's last meeting as a MAC member.

Karla said that it has been a pleasure serving on the MAC and that she liked getting involved in issues that the MAC has covered in the years that she has served. She stated from here on out she will be sitting on the other in attendance.

Supervisor Weygandt also indicated that he would be back at the MAC either January or February to give the State of County report.

He updated on issues regarding the Regional Sewer issues and the impact on Virginia Town Road. When the testing was done on the valves of the pipeline, 64 valves failed. All the valves will be replaced and tested. The paving of Virginia Town Road will need to be re-paved and that could be anywhere from 6 months to a year.

- The Placer County Board of Supervisors on November 3, 2015 approved amendments to Placer County's flood management policies that brings the County into compliance with state law requiring increased flood protection for urban areas.
- Supervisor Weygandt received a letter from a very unhappy Sheridan resident regarding the presence of no police; the homeless people in town, pot growing and robberies.
- Horseshoe Bar-Penryn Municipal Advisory Council members, at their Oct. 20 meeting, unanimously approved recommendation of changes to the Bickford Ranch project to both Placer County’s Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors.

9. **Informational - Non - Action Item:**

**A) Placer County Transportation Planning Agency's Current Feasibility Study for Expanding Transit Service**

The study process consisted of documentation for transit needs in rural Placer County; public and stakeholder input; evaluation of what which transit services make sense; consideration of impact to the overall performance of existing transit services and identification for recommended strategies.

The County is currently served for their transit needs by Placer County Transit; Auburn City Transit and Roseville Transit.

Current non traditional public transportation available to rural residents include

- Health Express – 745-7560 – advance reservation, shared ride, non emergency medical transportation for all eligible County residents (you must be a resident of Placer County and either 60+ years old or disabled. The cost for this program is \$1.25 one way with proper identification such Medicare, Medicaid, Medi-Cal, driver's license/ID card showing your age. Without proper ID the cost is \$2.50. For trips to Sacramento area hospitals/doctors the cost is \$5.00 one way or \$10.00 without proper ID.
- My rides -800-878-9222 – free transportation to non-emergency medical appointments and other essential service provided by volunteer drives, scheduled by Senior's First. Eligibility requirements: must be a Placer County resident, 60+ years, or a family of limited mean with children ages 0 to 5. (This is a volunteer program and the drivers will be reimbursed for their mileage)
- Both of these services go through Seniors First.

**B) Code Enforcement**

Ted Rel, Code Enforcement Supervisor introduced himself and provided a brief overview of what their services.

All Code Enforcement complaints must be in writing. You can write a complaint in an email.

Code enforcement does not start with immediate violation. They seek voluntary compliance and are given a 30-day notice.

If the party is non-compliant after 30 days they will receive a formal notice and will have 30 days to rectify.

If failure to comply within this timeframe, they will be given a Notice to Abate and will have 7 days to respond. Following that timeframe an administrative hearing will be set for non-compliance.

The violator can Appeal any decision made by the Hearing Officer, but this would be heard at the Placer County Superior Court.

On April 9, 2015 Code Enforcement started a weekend program for the purposes of enforcement of breweries, wineries and weddings. They have 3 officers, 1 supervisor and office staff. The hours are:

5 pm to 10 pm Thursday and Friday  
10 am to 10 pm Saturday and Sundays

The Code Enforcement number is 530-401-2889

The public is very grateful that there is finally a Code Enforcement Officer
