- 3, **Approval of Minutes:** Deirdre Lefty motioned to approve the November 16, 2015 - Joyce Bachman seconded motion. Minutes approved 4-0.
4. **Approval of Agenda:** Chair Alves proposed one change to the agenda. The date of next regular meeting is February 15, 2016 but due to a County Holiday the next meeting is February 22, 2016. William Morebeck, Director of NID wanted to inform the public about the regional water supply that would provide treated water to the City of Lincoln.

There will be a plant on Big Hill off Big Ben Road that would produce treated water beginning at 10 million gallons per day and up to 40 million by the complete build-out.

This would have no affect on agriculture.

9. Informational - Non - Action Item:

- A) **Celia McAdams of the PCTPA provided an update on future transportation issues in Placer County.**

Placer County Transportation Planning Agency consists of City of Auburn, Colfax,

Lincoln, Town of Loomis, Rocklin and Placer County. Their goal is to “Keep Placer Moving”

This includes bicycling. Pedestrian, trains, transit and airport and highway services.

Placer County is expected to grow 25% in the next 20 years.

Past, Current and Future Projects:

- In 2011 the Roseville bottleneck on I-80 (cost \$89 million) they added carpool and auxiliary lanes from County line at Riverside to Highway 65
- Lincoln Bypass (\$324 million) added 4 lanes from Industrial moving traffic around the City of Lincoln and connecting back to the existing highway 65 to Sheridan.
- I-80 Sierra College Interchange improvements (\$32 million)
- I-80 / Highway 65 interchange improvements (projected cost \$350 million)
- Widening Highway 65 from Galleria Blvd to Lincoln to include mix flow lanes, auxiliary lanes and carpool lanes.
- Local road maintenance – current pavement condition in the County is 85% or above

Federal and State transportation dollars are declining. Placer County is one of the largest counties in the State with no local transportation funding.

Transportation funding strategy

- Keep money we already have
- Leverage future State and Federal funding
- Additional developer impact fees
- High occupancy toll lanes
- Toll roads
- Transportation sales tax
