 - a. **Placer County** - Lyndell Grey, Associate Aide to Supervisor Robert Weygandt, (lgrey@placer.ca.gov or 530-889-4010): **1) Placer debuts new community welcome signs for its unincorporated communities** - Starting with six signs in Bowman and five in North Auburn. **2) Plan to fund transportation improvements placed on November ballots** - A ballot measure to increase retail sales tax by a half percent to raise funds for transportation improvements in Placer County by the County Board of Supervisors. The proposed measure, if approved by two-thirds of county voters, would be in effect for 30 years and would raise about \$1.6 billion to fund highway projects, public transit expansion, local street

maintenance and improvements and other projects in both suburban and rural areas of the county. **3) Placer and Nevada Counties receive statewide honor in joint effort to end opiate abuse** - Placer and Nevada County's community outreach campaign, "Rx Drug Safety Placer and Nevada County" was recently honored by the Health Officers Association of California with "Best Collaboration Between/Among Local Health Departments"; **4) Planned Changes Coming to 916 area code** - Public meetings hosted by the California Public Utilities Commission will be on August 15th and 16th in Sacramento, Folsom and Roseville <http://www.cpuc.ca.gov/916areacode/> . The 916 area code, which serves the cities of Lincoln, Rocklin, Roseville and unincorporated parts of western Placer County is expected to use up its available prefixes by March 2018. **5) State financing program a win-win for Placer County government and developers** - Community Development and Public Works projects in Placer County will soon be cheaper and faster after the County Board of Supervisors voted unanimously to join the Statewide Communities Infrastructure Program. **6) Placer County says farewell to Bookmobile, new mobile library coming soon** - After a storied, 45-year career of delivering books to the community, the beloved Placer County Bookmobile is driving off to a well-deserved retirement. A new mobile library is coming this fall, bringing the same excellent service to the community with a few exciting bonus features. **7) County to transition medical and dental clinic patients to Western Sierra Medical Clinic.** Placer County Department of Health and Human Services is in the process of working with county medical clinic staff on a seamless transition of county-operated medical and dental clinics to a private service provider. On July 12, the County Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the transition of county-operated medical and dental clinic patients in Auburn and Tahoe to Western Sierra Medical Clinic. **8) Placer supervisors approve nearly \$450,000 for visitor, tourism marketing services.** A contract between the Office of Economic Development and the Placer County Visitors Bureau has been extended to continue providing tourism promotion. Key tasks for this contract include marketing services, maintaining a comprehensive event calendar, outreach to the Bay Area and promotion of increased train travel, continued collaboration with the North Lake Tahoe Resort Association and mid-week bus tours, maintaining a strong presence across multiple social media platforms and building a new website. **9) Medical Marijuana Ordinance** - the County's approach is to only allow indoor growth - will wait until after November elections to see outcomes with the State and Federal laws. **10) Sheridan Annual Clean Up Day - August 27, 2016 from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.**

A. Update on Grant Opportunity from Caltrans for New Sheridan Pedestrian Facilities

The Grant Application was submitted in mid-June. The proposed items the funds will assist in are: new sidewalks; pathways and lighting. The following areas if the grant is approved are: concrete curb and sidewalks from 10 & 11th Streets to F Street. One side of 12th Street at F Street; H Street to Camp Far West Road; cross walk at Camp Far West Road and Riosa Rad; lighting behind school to Camp Far West; bus stop for transit one day a week which will be based on ridership. The estimated cost is 8.2 million. The County is requesting 6.4 million. If granted the County will have 4 to 5 years for completion of project. It will be mid-October before it is known if grant was approved.
