Regular Meeting

March 26, 2013

Minutes

Chairman Brodovsky called the meeting to order at 7:05 pm. He led the Pledge of Allegiance.

DIRECTORS PRESENT: Chairman Bob Brodovsky, Directors Mike Bishop, Anita Yoder and Patty Neifer. County Staff: Supervisor Jim Holmes and Administrative Aide Ruth Alves.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA: After reviewing the posted agenda, ***Director Bishop moved to approve the agenda as posted. Seconded by Director Neifer; motion carried unanimously.***

APPROVAL OF MINUTES/January 22, 2013: The January 22, 2013 minutes were unable to be approved due to the terming out of 2 Directors and the absence of another Director from the January meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Muriel Davis asked about Park Development Fees; general discussion was heard. Director Bishop asked if this matter could be a future agenda item discussing from concept/approval/completion. Also, a discussion was heard on Penryn Country Estates and some landscape improvements that was part of the initial project dating back to 2004. The county will address the issue and report back to the MAC.

PUBLIC SAFETY REPORTS:

- A. Penryn School Report/LUSD – Director Neifer reported on a district wide Solar project with possible installation as early as this summer, Penryn School has a new principal, Cara Alfonso; she is holding coffee meetings for parents and community members, several facility improvements at Penryn this summer including concrete repair and replacement and possibly refinishing the gym floor.
- B. Placer County Sheriff – Chairman Brodovsky reported that this time of the year is traditionally a low crime season; he reminded the audience to watch your neighborhood and notify the sheriff's office with any suspicious activity. Also, discussion was heard on mischief on Clark Tunnel and the Rail Road track, increase speeds on Taylor Road causing large animals being hit by cars.
- C. California Highway Patrol – No report.

COUNTY UPDATES: Supervisor Jim Holmes reported on the efforts of the Placer County Fire Chief's Association proposing workshops to explore ways to bring better ways to provide better service and other on-going problems facing small rural fire districts, he briefly explained county park fees going to schools stating that the facilities must be available after hours to qualify, he announced the appointment of the At-large commission representing the unincorporated area; he is Wayne Nader who lives in the unincorporated area, and lastly he stated that the Gold Hill Garden Event Center was granted its appeal.

INFORMATION/NON-ACTION ITEMS:

- A. Placer County Board of Supervisor's Priorities and Challenges for 2013-14 – Supervisor Holmes presented a power point presentation on what are the most reasonable balance of countywide priorities and availability of resources for 2013-14 and beyond. The CEO and staff presented what was needed to maintain a sustainable approach to operations in the coming years that ensures the county uses its limited resources to meet high-priority public service needs. A. Election of 2013 Chairperson – The MAC unanimously voted to retain Bob Brodovsky as Chairman of the Penryn Municipal Advisory Council for 2013. Director Mike Bishop will serve as Vice-Chairman.

They included the Rock Hill Winery and the Penryn Boat and RV Storage located at Sisley and Taylor Roads.
