- King fire is 100% contained.
- Update on the Applegate fire and the cause is still under investigation.
- Fire season is not over yet. Burn permits are required.
- Fire fuel is till really dry.
- Placer Hills Fire Department budget is 4.8% better than last year.

- Cal Fire lost a tanker pilot in an accident while fighting the Yosemite fire the day before the Applegate fire broke out.
- Total calls for Placer Hills Fire District in the month of October was 88 calls with a majority of the calls being medical aid calls.

- Supervisor Montgomery reported on the outpouring support for the Placer County Sheriff Deputy killed in the line of duty and the Deputy that was injured. The house where the alleged suspect of the incident by coincidence belonged to a County employee. The house is inhabitable due to the tear gas used. The County and the homeowners insurance is stepping up to assist the family. There is an organization called 10-35 where you can go and offer donations in the aid of the injured Deputy and the family of the deceased Deputy.

Overview of Placer County Office of Emergency Service provided by Program Manager for Placer County John McEldowney

The department provides emergency management services countywide, in cooperation with local cities and special districts, such as fire and law enforcement agencies. During an active incident such as a fire or flood requiring emergency sheltering,

During an active incident such as a fire or flood requiring emergency sheltering, OES helps to facilitate the resources necessary for first responders to protect the community.

Preparedness is all about pre-planning and education. OES prepares and participates in the preparation of various emergency and contingency plans ranging from evacuation plans to emergency operations plans. These plans help to specify roles and responsibilities of first responders and emergency management personnel during emergencies.

Organized trainings and exercises for Placer County staff and individuals of other agencies occur throughout the year.

The role of OES is to respond to emergencies in Placer County, assist first responders to access equipment and personnel resources, and to gather information on the incident so that we remain informed.

After an emergency incident is resolved, affected residents and communities begin to rebuild or recover from the situation. OES plays a large role in the recovery process, specifically coordinating with FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency), State, and County/City agencies for funding and other needed resources.

OES is working with multiple agencies of moving oil by rail from Lake Tahoe/Nevada down to Roseville. The department is trying to be proactive in this project.
