



THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF PLACER, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE THAT

WHEREAS, Joel Parker Whitney established the Placer Citrus Colony in the late 1800's in the Penryn/Loomis/Newcastle area, and as part of his development plans, improved the area through the planting of approximately 1,000 California Fan Palm Trees; and

WHEREAS, there remain approximately 500 trees still growing in the area, and the trees provide a beautiful and stately reminder of the history of the area and are trees of outstanding cultural value and community benefit;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the palm trees that remain, as of this date, from the original plantings, generally located in the areas depicted on the attached maps B-1, B-2, B-3, B-4, are hereby designated as "Landmark Trees" under Section 36.254, of Chapter 36, of the *Placer County Code*; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors adopts the maps attached hereto as Attachments B-1 through B-4 to show the approximate location of said Landmark Trees; provided, however, that any original California Fan Palm Trees that may not appear on said maps are also designated Landmark Trees, and shall be added to said maps as they become identified and located.


