The Unity Care Group, Inc. is a community-based non-profit multi-service youth and family development agency.





Did You Know?

- 60% of youth who leave the Foster Care system at age 18 are homeless within two years
- Less than 10% of foster children actually graduate from High School
- Only 3% of foster youth go on to a four year college
- 70% of San Quentin inmates grew up in Foster Care


Eligibility

ILP serves youth aged 16-21 who are current/former foster/probation youth, and are either preparing to exit foster care or are already aged out of care.



Services

ILP teaches young people the skills they need to become self sufficient by hosting regular workshops and offering individualized services. Each program staff encourages students to integrate the course materials as part of their daily lives. Along with the curriculum, program staff utilize outings, guest speakers and videos to enhance the learning process.
