6. **Public Comment:**
 - Resident Jackie Hoyt asked Supervisor Jones to address loopholes for traffic mitigation and affordable housing. Supervisor Jones will research and address.
 - Resident Cheryl Berkema expressed concern regarding traffic, sewer, and population studies and where they are. She also requested an update on the housing element.

7. Supervisor Report

- Supervisor Jones provided information on upcoming housing-related Zoning Code amendments, for which the public comment period is ending March 8, 2021.
- In response to resident requests from the February 3, 2021 MAC meeting, Supervisor Jones confirmed that there are no current applications on parcels on Barton Rd and Cavitt-Stallman Road. The Rancho Del Oro development has completed its improvement plans and is expected to start construction this year. It will include 89 one-acre lots.
- In response to questions regarding extensions for map approvals, EJ Ivaldi clarified that there can be two 3-year extensions, for a total of six years.
- Supervisor Jones advised that there will be a Town Hall meeting at Hillsborough Park on Saturday, March 21, 2021 at 10 am. Residents are encouraged to bring their own chairs and socially distance.

9. Council Member & Public Safety Reports

A. MAC Members

- Virgil Anderson congratulated and welcomed new MAC members Craig Estes and Sandra Harris.
- Amber Beckler reported on her participation in the American River Water Management water forum. She also expressed her desire to research and discuss how the Granite Bay Community Plan is enforced.

B. Placer County Sheriff's Office – Not present

C. California Highway Patrol – Officer Rob Luthy

- The Auburn office dealt with 126 collisions and 23 arrests (20 of which were DUIs).
- Captain Barker has retired and was replaced by Captain Brandon Straw.
- The Auburn office has been understaffed due to a number of factors, including academy closures, retirements, and budget changes. Granite Bay no longer has a Community Service officer assigned, but is still serviced by beat officers. The freeways tend to take up most of

their manpower, but he encouraged residents to continue report any problems.

- In response to a question, Officer Luthy clarified that there are no traffic cameras in use in Granite Bay. Roseville PD does use them extensively, so there are some at the borders that Granite Bay shares with Roseville.
