

Best Management Practices for Homeowners



Placer County's Stormwater Quality Ordinance, Article 8.28.080 states that it is "unlawful for any person to make or cause illicit discharges." Here are some ways that will help avoid violations, and will help protect our waterways.

Drain your swimming pool or hot tub only when a test kit does not detect any chlorine or other toxic chemicals. Check with the Sewer District before discharging swimming pool water into a public sewer.

Wash pool filter in a sink or on the lawn to prevent stormwater contamination.

Store pool and spa chemicals in a covered area to avoid exposure to stormwater.

Residential outdoor burning of dry vegetation, grown on premises, is allowed on a permissive burn day.


Put trash can out only on collection day to prevent animals from spilling.

Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly and according to directions. Avoid application if rain is in the forecast.

Vegetate or mulch bare spots in your yard to prevent erosion.

Don't over water your lawn, letting water run off into the storm drains.

Check your vehicles, machinery and equipment for leaks and spills. Make repairs as soon as possible. Clean up spilled fluids with an absorbent such as kitty litter. Do not hose spills into the street, gutters or storm drains.



Sweep up sidewalks, patios, and decks of yard debris and dispose of it in a covered compost pile or trash can. Do not hose, sweep, or blow yard debris into street, gutters, or storm drains!

Always recycle automotive fluids at appropriate disposal sites or recycling facilities. See county web site for locations.

Direct pressure-washing runoff onto an unpaved surface or vegetated area, not into the street, gutters, storm drains, or public sewers.

Pick up pet waste. Flush or secure it in a plastic bag and dispose of it in your trash.

Use a commercial car wash or wash your car on a lawn or other unpaved surface to reduce the amount of car wash water runoff.

Before beginning an outdoor project, protect all storm drains nearby by covering and capturing sediment.

Send cleaning/wash water down a sink or toilet, not into the street, gutters or storm drains.

Do not connect downspouts to drainage pipes. Allow to drain to vegetated areas.

Clean water based painting equipment in the sink, not outdoors. Dispose of excess paints, cleaners, solvents, etc. through a household hazardous waste collection program.
