SUBJECT: Board of State and Community Corrections Proposition 47 Lead Agency Award

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve an agreement, resulting from RFP #10673, with Community Recovery Resources for the period of January 9, 2018 through August 15, 2020, in the amount of \$862,541 and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to sign the agreement with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence and to sign any subsequent amendments not to exceed \$50,000 of the total contract amount, consistent with the subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BACKGROUND

In November 2014, California voters approved Proposition 47: the Safe Neighborhoods and Schools Act in order to ensure that prison spending is focused on violent and serious offenses, to maximize alternatives for non-serious, nonviolent crime, and to invest the savings generated from this act into prevention and support programs in K-12 schools, victim services, and mental health and drug treatment.

In February of 2017 Placer County HHS in collaboration with Placer County Probation submitted a proposal to create the Placer County Action Team: Promoting Community Health and Safety. Placer County's proposal was one of only 28 in the state to be selected for an award.

On September 5th 2017 this board adopted a resolution accepting the Board of State and Community Corrections Grant Proposition 47 grant award in the amount of \$990,000 (no net County cost), for the period of July 1, 2017 through August 15, 2020. It was a requirement of this award that a minimum of fifty percent of the funds went to community based organizations. Placer County's proposal was for one lead agency to implement the Action Team in collaboration with Placer County Probation and Health and Human Services. Community Recovery Resources was selected through a competitive RFP process.

The Placer County Proposition 47 Action Team will deliver strengths-based, youth and family-driven, wraparound services to address mental health, substance use, and diversion needs of young adults, ages 18-32. This program will deliver mental health and/or substance use treatment as well as provide support in finding safe and stable housing, developing vocational or educational skills, and creating positive social communities to support healthy choices. Services will be tailored to the individual's needs, culturally competent, and trauma-informed, with an overall goal to divert individuals and prevent recidivism from the criminal justice system and to promote safe and healthy communities.

FISCAL IMPACT

All costs of this contract are included in the Board of State and Community Corrections Grant Proposition 47 grant award (no net County cost). Expenditures in the amount of \$209,785 for the first year of this grant are included in the FY 2017-18 Final Budget through a final budget adjustment. Expenditures for Year 2 and Year 3 in the annual amounts of \$314,330 and \$338,426 respectively will be included in the FY 2018-19 and FY 2019-20 Requested Budgets.
