Subject: **PROJECT NO. 04755 - SHERIDAN INFLOW AND INFILTRATION  
REPAIRS, PHASE II**

**ACTION REQUESTED / RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that your Board take the following actions associated with the Sheridan Inflow and Infiltration Repairs:

1. Approve Plans and Specifications and authorize staff to solicit bids for Project No. 04755 Sheridan Inflow and Infiltration Repairs, Phase II.
2. Approve a Resolution authorizing the Director of Facility Services to execute the resulting construction contract in an amount not-to-exceed \$155,000, and authority to approve any required change orders consistent with the County Purchasing Manual and Section 20142 of the Public Contract Code.

**BACKGROUND:** Placer County owns and operates a sanitary sewer collection system in Sheridan, CA that conveys wastewater from approximately 184 connections to the wastewater treatment facility (WWTF). The collection system was constructed in 1969 and currently experiences excessive amounts of inflow and infiltration (I&I) during the wet weather months that result in serious capacity problems at the WWTF.

In 2004, the County completed Phase I repairs to the sewer collection system. These repairs totaled \$207,500 and were funded through a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG). In 2005, the community of Sheridan received a second CDBG for \$180,000 to fund additional I&I repairs to the sanitary sewer collection system. Staff has prepared engineered plans and specifications focusing on the sections of the collection system most in need of repairs.

In order to complete the repair work this construction season, staff recommends that your Board authorize staff to solicit bids and authorize the Director of Facility Services to execute the resulting construction contract.

**ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE:** The repair work include in this project is exempt from environmental review pursuant to Section 15301 "Existing Facilities" of the California Environmental Quality guidelines. A Notice of Exemption was filed in 2004. Federal environmental clearance was completed by the Placer County Redevelopment Agency pursuant to the National Environmental Protection Act and was submitted as part of the filings for the CDBG special conditions.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** Based upon the Engineer's estimate, the total construction cost for the project is estimated to be \$155,000 which includes an approximate 15% contingency. This project will be funded by the CDBG and is budgeted in project 04755 of the FY 2006/07 Capital Projects Budget.
