SUBJECT: Agreement with County of Nevada – Core STD Program Management

ACTION REQUESTED

1. Approve an agreement with County of Nevada to facilitate its receipt of State STD Community Interventions Program (SCIP) grant funding for the period of July 1, 2016, through June 30, 2019, for a total amount not to exceed \$4,797.
2. Authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to execute the agreement with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence and to sign amendments not to exceed 10 percent of the total contract amount, consistent with the subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BACKGROUND

The mission of the STD Control Branch is to reduce the transmission and impact of sexually transmitted diseases and viral hepatitis in California. The branch supports the prevention efforts by providing statewide leadership, guidance, training, technical assistance, surge capacity and safety net support for delivering services throughout the state. CDPH carries out this mission by collaborating with local health jurisdictions and stakeholders in the public and private sectors, including the provision of grant monies.

Key strategic targets for STD prevention and control are: implementation of case-based surveillance; assurance of timely access to quality clinical services; verification of appropriate STD treatment; investigation of reported cases, unusual diseases, or outbreaks; identification of a STD patient's sexual and social network contacts; referral for examination and/or treatment to prevent further disease transmission or complications; and, health education and health promotion activities to prevent STDs and enhance awareness of individuals at risk for STD, medical providers, and other service providers within the community.

The agreement is necessary with Nevada County because the State requires that Local Health Jurisdictions (LHJs) that are below a certain funding threshold need to contract with another LHJ to abide by the State's terms of the grant funding to receive the funds.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for this agreement is 100% grant funded and is reflected in the FY 2017-18 Proposed Budget.
