

GENERAL PROVISIONS AND HOLD HARMLESS:

1. The Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the County, its officers, officials, agents, employees and volunteers, from and against any and all claims, suits, proceedings, costs, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees), damages and liabilities claimed by any person, organization, association or otherwise arising out of or relating to any act or omission of the Permittee, its agents, contractors or employees under this Agreement. Such indemnification shall not be effective to the extent that the damage or injury results from the sole negligence of the County. The indemnification provided for in this permit shall survive any termination of this Agreement.
2. The Permittee has read, understood and agrees to comply with all County Regulations and Procedures (including Bridge Regulations if applicable) as regards production activity under this permit, as well as the General Provisions, and Special Provisions if required.
3. Permit is not valid without signatures, approvals.
4. Permittee is responsible for obtaining all pertinent permissions and permits for production activities in Placer County.
5. Permit must be physically on location during production activity.
6. The applicant's Certificate of Insurance and a copy of their insurance policy's Endorsement Page listing Placer County as Additional Insured must be on file with County prior to application review and permit approval.
7. *SPECIAL PROVISIONS: in addition to the General Provisions above, Special Provisions may be added during the permit review and approval stage. Applicant agrees to abide by all Special Provisions as may be required as a condition of permit approval.*

Permit Application Turn-Around Time:

Due to the evolving COVID-19 situation it is not as easy to predict how long it will take to process applications and issuing film permits so please allow more lead time when applying for a film permit. Productions should expect a minimum 2 - 4 day turn-around at this point for basic scenes such as B-roll, small dialog scenes, small photo shoots, minimal crew. For more complicated scenes expect longer turn-around times. These would include road closures and traffic control, drone filming, multiple agency coordination, pyro, and complex locations like bridges, courthouses, etc. We recommend contacting the Film Office in advance of completing the application in case the review process brings up any circumstances that must be met prior to the permit being issued.
