SUBJECT: Medi-Cal Targeted Case Management Provider Participation Agreement

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**ACTION REQUESTED**

Approve the evergreen Provider Participation Agreement (PPA) with the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) for the provision of Targeted Case Management (TCM) services to eligible Medi-Cal beneficiaries effective July 01, 2020 and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to sign the agreement with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence and subsequent amendments consistent with the current agreement's subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

**BACKGROUND**

Targeted Case Management (TCM) is a Medi-Cal-reimbursable program that was first implemented in Placer County in FY 1995-96. The program allows skilled professional medical personnel to provide specialized face-to-face case management services to eligible Medi-Cal individuals to assist them in gaining access to needed medical, social, educational, or other services. This includes initial and periodic assessments, care plan development, assistance in accessing medical services through referral and linkage to Medi-Cal providers. It may also include assistance related to non-medical issues, such as life skills, social support, or environmental barriers that may impact health, impede access to care or successful implementation of medical care plans. Skilled professional medical personnel, including public health nurses and medical social workers provide services to the following target populations:

- Medically fragile individuals 18 years of age or older with multiple diagnoses or at high risk for medical compromise
- Individuals 18 years of age or older at risk of institutionalization
- Individuals 18 years of age or older in jeopardy of negative health or psycho-social outcomes

This contract allows Placer County, as a local governing agency (LGA), to invoice DHCS for overseeing TCM services within its jurisdiction. The Placer County Public Health Division is the only entity in Placer County currently participating in the TCM Program.

**FISCAL IMPACT**

There is no dollar amount on TCM provider participation agreements. Providers are reimbursed on a fee-for-service basis.

The agreement is on file with the Clerk of the Board for review.
