SUBJECT: California Department of Public Health – Infectious Disease Prevention and Control Local -
Infrastructure

ACTION REQUESTED

1. Approve a Budget Revision in the amount of \$326,986.35 for expenditures with offsetting revenue from the California Department of Public Health Infectious Disease Prevention and Control Local-Infrastructure Grant.
2. Adopt a Resolution authorizing the Director of Health and Human Services to sign the agreement with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) for the prevention and control of infectious diseases in an amount not to exceed \$326,986.35 for the period of February 1, 2020 to June 30, 2023, with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence and to sign subsequent amendments not to exceed \$32,698 consistent with the subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BACKGROUND

The original intent of this funding was to support increased public health activities at the local health jurisdiction level over the next four fiscal years, aimed at reducing the spread of infectious diseases. Key strategic efforts for this work includes surveillance, monitoring and evaluating disease specific prevention activities, and increasing local capacity to respond to surge outbreaks. However, on April 13, 2020, CDPH redirected these funds to allow them to immediately be utilized for COVID-19 response activities. Current response focus areas include emergency operations and coordination, responder safety and health, identification of vulnerable populations, emergency public information and risk communication, and quarantine and isolation support, public health coordination with healthcare systems. The redirected funding will continue to bolster these efforts and allow for expansion in the areas of staffing, contracts, and securing supplies.

FISCAL IMPACT

The grant amount of \$326,986.35 is funded with State Funds. The amount of \$326,986.35 will be included in the FY 2019-2020 Budget with the included Budget Revision. The funds beyond FY 2019-20 will be included in future budgets.

WHEREAS Placer County Health and Human Services Department through its Public Health Division desires to accept the revenue agreement with the California Department of Public Health for the prevention and control of infectious diseases within Placer County's local health jurisdiction in the amount of \$326,986.35 for the period of February 1, 2020 through June 30, 2023.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Director of Health and Human Services, be authorized on behalf of the Placer County Board of Supervisors to sign the revenue agreement 19-10898 with the California Department of Public Health for the prevention and control of infectious diseases within Placer County's local health jurisdiction in the amount of \$326,986.35 for the period of February 1, 2020 through June 30, 2023, and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to sign the agreement and subsequent amendments not to exceed \$32,698 of the original contract total amount, consistent with subject matter and scope of work and Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.
