SUBJECT: Contract Amendment With Restpadd Health Corp For Short-Term Acute Inpatient Psychiatric Services

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve a contract amendment with Restpadd Health Corp for the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020 for psychiatric health facility services increasing by \$400,000 for a total amount not to exceed \$1,100,000 and authorize the Director of Health and Human Services to sign the contract with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence and any subsequent amendments up to \$100,000 consistent with subject matter and scope of work with Risk Management and County Counsel concurrence.

BACKGROUND

Placer County System of Care provides mandated mental health crisis intervention services to adults and children who are experiencing a mental health crisis. During FY 2018-19, over 3,300 individuals received crisis evaluation services and approximately half of those required inpatient psychiatric hospitalization. If the County Psychiatric Health Facility (PHF) is at capacity, individuals are referred to alternate facilities such as other PHFs, Crisis Stabilization Units, or private inpatient psychiatric hospitals (as a last resort). During the past 6 months the County has seen an increase in need for inpatient hospitalization and other contracted PHF's have often been at full capacity. Restpadd PHF has accepted a higher volume of clients than what would be expected as these other facilities have accepted less referrals.

Maintaining this contract is critical given the shortage of psychiatric beds across the State. The County has contracted with PHF's in other counties, but bed capacity at these PHF's is often full. Individuals in crisis often spend unnecessary hours in our overcrowded local emergency departments waiting for available psychiatric beds. The additional option of Restpadd PHF will further help reduce the burden of crowded emergency departments in our community, while avoiding the most expensive option of private hospitalization.

FISCAL IMPACT

Funding consists of \$380,000 (95%) in State and Federal revenues and \$20,000 (5%) in County General funds and is included in the FY 2019-20 Budget.
