Hi Kelly and Aimee,

I think Cindy is our supervisor and appreciate your reply.

I do not feel comfortable going to the grocery store, about the only time I leave home. Face mask usage in Auburn at Save Mart, Raley's and Bel Air appears to me to vary from between 20 to 90% depending on the time of day. Often those who don't wear masks do not stay 6 feet away.

I've sent emails to both Raley's and Save Mart customer service asking them to have one-way aisles and to require facemasks, and have received no replies.

I have an underlying condition and don't think requiring someone to cover the nose and mouth is asking too much to help protect the more vulnerable. It has been the recommendation of our county public health officer.

I support making it mandatory, as it is in other counties.

Good morning Teri,

My husband and I are residents of Rocklin and business owners and are concerned because the latest Placer County publication regarding our shelter-in-place directive it's quite confusing. We own rental buildings in Rocklin and in Sacramento and don't know if our Rocklin tenants are or aren't allowed to open their operations as of May 1st. Under very explicit and precise communication from Sacramento County we know that the Sacramento office will be able to start conducting business as usual on May 1st, however we don't know if our Rocklin dental office tenant will be able to resume business on that day or not.

The governor specifically indicated that residents should follow the local government directives and thus we are asking you to give us specific and clear directions, rather than leaving it under the governor's Executive order. We need specific directions based on our local demographics and Covid-19 situation not based on a statewide situation which is gravely skewed by larger urban areas such as Los Angeles and San Francisco.

Please see below and advise.

While statewide shelter-in-place order remains in effect, Placer County looks ahead to phased reopening.

AUBURN, Calif. — As of Saturday, May 2, Placer County's local health order will expire and residents will be guided by the governor's Executive Order to shelter in place — removing any confusion over areas of difference between the two orders. This transition will allow a focus on planning for a phased reopening in partnership with local governments, health care, business and other stakeholders, as well as regional and state partners.

My name is Vicky Sala, and I am a Placer County Realtor. I am reaching out to you today, because I have a client who is currently in Escrow on her first home. She is a Registered Dental Hygienist, and scheduled to close on May 15th. She cannot close on her loan until she returns to work, which brings me to you.

The guidelines of "Essential Workers" that we're updated on the County website, effective April 28, 2020, specifically (Copied directly from <https://www.placer.ca.gov/coronavirus/guidance>) states:

Definition of Health Care Operations:

Health Care Operations include hospitals, clinics, dentists, pharmacies, pharmaceutical and biotechnology companies, other healthcare facilities, health care suppliers, home health care services providers, mental health providers, public health, or any related and/or ancillary health care services. Health Care Operations also include veterinary care and all health care services provided to animals. Health Care Operations does not include fitness and exercise gyms and similar facilities, nor does it include barbering, the beauty industry, and grooming of pets for cosmetic purposes.

Additionally, I have been monitoring the State of California Guidelines for Covid-19, and have found the following information, (copied directly from <https://covid19.ca.gov/essential-workforce/>)

1. Healthcare / Public Health

Sector profile

The Healthcare and Public Health (HPH) Sector is large, diverse, and open, spanning both the public and private sectors. It includes publicly accessible healthcare facilities, research centers, suppliers, manufacturers, and other physical assets and vast, complex public-private information technology systems required for care delivery and to support the rapid, secure transmission and storage of large amounts of HPH data.

Essential workforce, if remote working is not practical:

1. Health care providers and caregivers (including physicians, dentists, psychologists, mid-level practitioners, nurses, assistants, and aids; infection control and quality assurance personnel; pharmacists; physical, respiratory, speech and occupational therapists and assistants; social workers and providers serving individuals with disabilities including developmental disabilities; optometrists; speech pathologists; chiropractors; diagnostic and therapeutic technicians; and radiology technologists).

Workers required for effective clinical, command, infrastructure, support service, administrative, security and intelligence operations across the direct patient care and full healthcare and public health spectrum, including accounting, administrative, admitting and discharge, engineering, accrediting,

Would you please provide guidance on whether a Dental Practice, capable of providing all of the social distancing protocol, PPE and all other requirements, inclusive, is able to re-open in Placer County for both General and Preventive services.
