Most seniors have been staying home and are expected to stay there until the state fully reopens for their own protection from people that don't do physical distancing in public. 43% of cases in Placer County are in the 18-49 age group and I expect our numbers will continue to

increase as we reopen.

If the county can reaffirm a local emergency due to tree mortality since Dec 8, 2015 (Resolution 2015-253); why not reaffirm the current one effecting people to make sure we still qualify for emergency funds? Or are trees more important than people? Lincoln reaffirmed a local emergency months after a tanker fire closed the downtown area and high school to protect funding. Mr Uhler has told us of the need to reopen businesses in the county and to not worry about COVID-19. I am more afraid of people getting sick and dying of COVID-19 than being able to get a hair cut or my nails done. But some shops have reopened even against the county and state's directive. Telling a doctor to not do their job to keep people safe is foolish. The track and tracing of cases is needed. What would happen if diseases like TB, Measles, Hepatitis or STD contacts were not followed up on? If everything is wonderful why spend \$250,000 on seroprevalence testing? Please reaffirm the COVID-19 emergency for Placer County and protect the county from foolishness and loss of the emergency funding we need for our communities to get thru this unprecedented time. Lets not cut off our nose to spite our face. We are in a state of emergency.

Placer County was just approved to move to the partial re-opening phase and there has been insufficient time to see results from testing and potential surge of disease since it takes approximately 2 weeks for symptoms to show. We just re-opened this phase, 7 days ago, and are just getting started on testing and tracing. Please follow the states plan for re-opening in phases and protect the constituents of this county. Our lives are more important than a haircut!

- I DO NOT support rescinding resolution 2020-035.
- I DO NOT support rescinding the authority of the County Health Officer.
- I DO NOT support rescinding the declaration of the Local Health Emergency made by the County Health Officer.

This pandemic is not over! Just because we are starting the re-opening phase doesn't mean the disease and the emergency has gone away. Following the state and governors orders, sheltering in place has given us a reprieve and flattened the curve, however opening to quickly and not taking proper precautions will certainly cause the disease to surge in our community, spread quickly, and we will be unable to trace/track.

The Flash Vote recently put out on this issue shows that a very large part of our community is concerned about opening to fast (56% with the highest response) and comments on Flash Vote

show the majority of people are very concerned about other people not wearing masks.

Comments from the last special session were almost unanimously against you doing anything but following the governor's orders. Both from those that called in and those that submitted emails. The comments on the website from the last session show only about 8 supporting you with over 130 against opening too quickly. Are you even listening to the people that voted you in?

I understand that small businesses need to re-open and the way to do that safely is to do this in phases so we have a chance to see the spread a few weeks down the road. They need to continue the recommendations for disinfecting, physical distancing... and if you truly care about ALL your constituents and not just the businesses, require masks for all employees AND customers. If you don't, you are also putting employees in double jeopardy. You are making it easier for them to become infected by customers not covering their mouth and nose (one cough or sneeze is all it takes), and also putting them at risk to angry customers who refuse to wear a mask. This is not a rights infringement, it's a public health issue! It's no different than requiring shirts and shoes in restaurants. Requiring masks makes sense and it's an easy fix to help protect our community members and employees health, while allowing businesses to start re-opening. The two items on the May 20 agenda seem to conflict. The first proposes a study to learn more about how exactly the pandemic is affecting Placer County. The second proposes to terminate the current state of emergency as though we already know what there is to know about this virus and are ready to resume normal life.

Only a tiny fraction of our population has yet been tested for the virus, and We have no idea how many asymptomatic carriers we may have. We do not know how well or how long recovered COVID-19 patients are protected by antibodies, nor are there yet effective treatments for the disease, let alone a vaccine.

The Board of Supervisors should not try to second guess our public health officials. Leave the emergency declaration decision to the scientific experts who have a far better grasp of the consequences of relaxing the shutdown too soon. Hi Supervisor Holmes,

With regards to the first agenda item, I agree data should shape policy. I question if the dollars spent are worth the data and information a seroprevalence study will yield, though. If the study could show that a large percentage of our population was previously exposed, that'd be helpful, but there's a greater likelihood the study will show what's been consistently shown in other areas and countries which is only 1-7% of the population has been exposed. This is nowhere close to the 50-70% needed for herd immunity. Reviewing hospitalization data from January through March might even indicate our exposure has been much less than other areas. I wonder if our dollars would be better spent in providing services or filling in gaps of funding, especially if the second item were to pass.

The second item raises a lot of questions and concerns. What does our county gain and what do we lose if the local emergency order is rescinded? We're on the path to reopen and it will take a couple weeks before we anticipate an increase in cases and hospitalizations. Why not wait until we can evaluate the impact? While I know the positive cases in the hospitals have steadily declined, the numbers of suspected cases have actually risen.

If the emergency order is removed, does that mean all our businesses can reopen? If I understand correct, the state orders and guidelines still supersede local jurisdictions so I'm unclear what is actually gained by rescinding the emergency declaration.

Equally important and more concerning is what do we stand to lose? Emergency declarations are made to access state and federal funding, resources and disaster relief. Given the economic impact this has had on our county, local jurisdictions, businesses, and community residents, why would we even consider taking these dollars and resources off the table? It'll likely be diverted to other jurisdictions so our tax dollars will be used to help other jurisdictions? We also don't know the impact of reopening, nor do we know what will happen in the fall/winter when we have Coronavirus and the regular flu circulating at the same time. Why would we set ourselves up for another crisis when we're on the path to recovery? Unless there was considerable gain, it makes no sense why this is even being considered.

We're in a crisis which doesn't look to be over anytime soon. We need to pull together as a community and this type of action creates unnecessary division, conflict and distraction which is the last thing we need. I urge you and the other board of supervisors to focus on good governance and actions which support moving Placer County forward.

Members of the Board:

I am very disappointed that Mr. Uhler and other Board members have initiated the Special Board Meeting scheduled for this evening. From all that I have read, Placer County is well launched into Stage Two of the California Roadmap Stay-At-Home Policy.

I have read Mr. Weygandt's postings with interest, and listened to him and Mr. Uhler pontificate on the subject via the phone hook-up of last week's Board meeting. The gist is that Public Health has gone too far and we need to just throw open the doors of Placer County to all comers. I understand that small businesses need to re-open. I believe that the State of CA understands that many counties have very different levels of the illness and are working to allow those at low risk to open sooner, once various standards are met, including contact tracers. This Pandemic is new to all of us and much has been learned along the way, of how to manage the various wants and needs of society and the various states, counties and cities, including rural areas. Be thankful for what we have: low case numbers, low death numbers and a public that has responded positively to the recommendations of our Placer County Health Officer: staying at home, hand washing, wearing a face covering, etc. But, also be mindful that the low numbers could change in a flash. Who expected 14 cases associated with Auburn Ravine Terrace – all according to the Auburn Journal, asymptomatic. Hence the importance of wearing a face covering. My big concern is that big numbers of people will rush from the Bay Area and other hot spots and bring the virus with them and spread it all over Placer County. I know that businesses in the Sierras and Lake Tahoe, as well as the Foothills are desperate to open, but at the same time have to remain cautious and vigilant. So, it is a trade-off of open full-blast and risk a drastic spread, or proceed with measured caution. My vote is to proceed with caution and encourage EVERYONE to wear a face covering, wash their hands, don't touch your face, etc.

Please do not blame Public Health for what you view as totally wrong-doing. Government officials at various levels, physicians, scientists, public health professionals, First Responders, nurses and everyone on the front-lines are all doing the best they can – for the most part. It is extremely unfortunate that this event has become politicized to the point that medical professionals have been fired or muzzled, agencies and departments have had their budgets frozen and/or cut and the news coming from Washington, DC is so tainted with untruths that it is a wonder that people can get a straight answer. This virus is not RED or BLUE. When the dust settles a bit, there will be time to examine what went wrong, what went right and what can we do to be better prepared for the next outbreak, which could happen this summer or fall or until an appropriate vaccine is found and given to enough people to provide herd immunity.

Wouldn't it be more prudent to wait until we are well into Phase 3 before ending the emergency? It appears to me that this move is designed to transfer decision making power from the Health Department to the BOS. It is too early for this.

Why is the county proposing to spend \$250,000 on a seroprevalence study? Sure, this would be interesting information to have, but I don't see where this is required to move into Phase 3 of the state's reopening plan. Based on other studies that have been done (in particular the Stanford MLB study), the results will almost certainly be somewhere in the range of 1% to 3%. There, I just saved us \$250,000. This is a waste of money at time where we need to be extra prudent with our spending.

I fear these actions are an indication that the BOS is reconsidering a lawsuit against the state based on Kirk Uhler's flawed interpretation of the state codes. I'm not an attorney, but it's very easy to see where Kirk's reasoning fails.

Government code 8625 authorizes the governor to implement a "state of emergency" for a specific local area. Government code 8558 authorizes the governor to implement a "State of emergency" for the entire state. The governor issued a State of emergency for the entire state under 8558. He did not issue a

state of emergency for Placer County under 8625. Kirk is conflating the two and is trying to use 8625 to show that the order issued under 8558 is invalid. I've tried informing Kirk of his error, but he has banned me from his Facebook page.
