Grant Program Now Open!

The Placer County Air Pollution Control District's CAP Incentives Program makes available grants to private fleets and public agencies in order to clean up their heavy-duty fleets beyond what is required by law. Options include repowering or replacing vehicles and equipment with the cleanest engines possible. CAP Incentives also fund infrastructure projects to support California's transformation towards zero and near-zero technologies.

Grant possibilities include:

- School bus replacements for public schools
- Diesel to diesel or CNG heavy-duty equipment replacements
- Electric charging stations for businesses and public agencies
- CNG or hydrogen fueling infrastructure
- Diesel agricultural pump electrification plus infrastructure

Funding Available for Projects That Reduce Air Pollution in Placer County

The Placer County Air Pollution Control District is seeking applications for their Community Air Protection (CAP) Incentives Program for projects that reduce air pollution. This program is primarily designed to reduce smog related emissions such as nitrogen oxides (NOx), reactive organic gases (ROG's), and particulate matter (PM) emissions.

Grant project categories include:

- Heavy duty off-road equipment replacements (small off-road and agricultural fleets only)
- Electric charging and CNG or hydrogen fueling stations for private and public entities (residential not eligible)
- Heavy duty on-road diesel to low NOx or electric vehicle replacements (>14,000 # GVWR)
- School bus replacements (diesel to diesel, diesel to electric)
- And more

This is a competitive grant program and cost-effectiveness will be considered when determining project funding amounts. All projects selected for funding must primarily benefit disproportionately impacted communities within Placer County.

Deadline extended to December 11, 2020, 5 pm

(Applications must be original versions and be submitted by mail or hand delivered. Call prior to delivery. Office may be open by appointment only. Applications received after the deadline will not be accepted)
