SUBJECT: Ordinance Amending Placer County Code Chapter 10, Article 10.12, Entitled
"Parking" and Resolution Describing Properties with Restricted Parking

ACTION REQUESTED

1. Adopt an ordinance, introduced January 12, 2021, amending Placer County Code Chapter 10, Article 10.12 to restrict overnight parking at two Park and Ride lots and several county properties and to update related enforcement provisions.
2. Adopt a resolution describing county properties with restricted overnight parking.
3. Approve budget amendment AM-00425 to transfer \$22,500 from Community and Agency Support to Building Maintenance for the cost and installation of 60 signs.

BACKGROUND

California Vehicle Code section 22507 allows the County to prohibit or restrict the stopping, parking, or standing of vehicles on its roads during all or certain hours of the day. Further, California Vehicle Code section 21113 prohibits stopping, parking, or leaving a vehicle standing upon the driveways, paths, parking facilities, or grounds of a county park, any property under the direct control of the board of supervisors, or a county institution or building without permission from and subject to any condition or regulation that may be imposed by the board of supervisors.

The proposed ordinance amendment would add Section 10.12.290 to the Placer County Code, which would prohibit parking between the hours of 10:00pm and 6:00 a.m. on county properties identified by the Board of Supervisors by resolution. Properties affected by this ordinance are listed in the attached resolution. If adopted by your board, the resolution must be kept on file with the Clerk of the Board.

The proposed ordinance would allow overnight parking of county-owned vehicles, emergency vehicles, and vehicles with a county-issued parking permit. Overnight parking permits may be issued to employees, contractors, or clients of overnight services. In addition, the proposed ordinance makes some minor updates to existing language, such as updating the name of the department of public works and updating references to relevant provisions of the Vehicle Code. The amendment also clarifies that the Sheriff and other law enforcement agencies are responsible for enforcing the overnight parking restrictions on county properties, whereas the director of public works is authorized to enforce parking restrictions on county roads.

The proposed ordinance adds the Ophir Park and Ride parking lot and the Meadow Vista / Clipper Gap Park and Ride parking lot to the table in Section 10.12.120 and prohibits parking at those locations between 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.

Pursuant to Vehicle Code sections 22651 and 21113, signage must be posted before these parking restrictions may be enforced.

The attached resolution lists an initial 12 county properties that will have overnight parking restrictions, and reflects the first phase of an ongoing effort. Facilities Management estimates a cost of \$375 per sign, but staff will gain a better understanding of signage cost and installation logistics after this initial phase. Therefore, Facilities Management is requesting \$22,500 for the initial 60 signs to be installed. Subsequent costs for signage in additional phases will be included in future budgets.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

The requested action is exempt from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") pursuant to CEQA Guidelines § 15301 (operation of existing facilities) and 15061(b)(3) (no possibility of a significant effect on the environment).

FISCAL IMPACT

Fiscal impact of signage costs for the first phase for this ordinance is \$22,500, funded through budget amendment AM-00425 from Community and Agency Support to Building Maintenance.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF PLACER ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Placer County Code Chapter 10, Article 10.12, Part 3, Section 10.12.090, entitled "Limitation," is hereby amended as follows:

A. It is unlawful and a violation of the provisions of this article for any person to permit any vehicle to remain or be placed or be parked in excess of the parking limitations established by the board of supervisors when so designated by signs or markings.

B. The director of public works ~~and facilities~~ or designee shall have the authority to determine when parking adjacent to any intersection or driveway shall be restricted.

1. Parking within fifty (50) feet of a stop sign, yield sign, crosswalk, or a side street approach to an intersection with a through street is prohibited when designated as such by the director of public works ~~and facilities~~ or designee through the use of signs or curb markings.

2. Parking adjacent to an uncontrolled intersection is restricted when designated as such by the director of public works and facilities or designee through the use of signs or curb markings, to a distance determined necessary by county engineers and in accordance with the California Department of Transportation’s Highway Design Manual.

SECTION 2. Placer County Code Chapter 10, Article 10.12, Part 4, Section 10.12.120, entitled “Limitations imposed,” is hereby amended as follows:

<u>Truckee River Trailhead Parking (Henrikson Parcels)</u>	<u>19021 W. River Street, Truckee, CA 96161</u> <u>19031 W. River Street, Truckee, CA 96161</u>	<u>No parking any time</u>

SECTION 3. Placer County Code Chapter 10, Article 10.12, Part 5, Section 10.12.140, entitled “Responsibility for parking enforcement,” is hereby amended as follows:

A. ~~DeWitt. It shall be the responsibility of the director of general services and his or her employees to enforce the restrictions of this part at DeWitt.~~ **The sheriff and designees are responsible for enforcing restrictions described in Section 10.12.290.** ~~Such Director and employees are~~ **Any legally authorized law enforcement agency, including the sheriff, may** ~~empowered to~~ **arrest cite** persons for violations of such parking restrictions, to issue parking citations under Vehicle Code Sections 22507 and 41102, et seq., and to arrange for the towing away of illegally parked vehicles under Vehicle Code Sections **22651 and** 22654.

B. ~~County Roads Generally. It shall be the responsibility of the director of public works and facilities and designees to enforce the restrictions of this part.~~ **The director of public works and designees are responsible for enforcing restrictions on county roads generally, including those described in Section 10.12.120.** Such director and designees are empowered to ~~arrest~~ **arrest cite** persons for violations of such parking restrictions, to issue parking citations under Vehicle Code Sections 22507 and 41102, et seq., and to arrange for the towing away of illegally parked vehicles under Vehicle Code Sections **22651 and** 22654. **This authority is in addition to the authority conferred under the Streets and Highways Code.**

SECTION 4. Placer County Code Chapter 10, Article 10.12, Part 7, Section 10.12.200, entitled “Civil penalty provisions,” is hereby amended as follows:

A. Notwithstanding any other provision of this article, any person violating or failing to comply with the provisions of Section 12.04.110, 10.12.020(B), 10.12.030(B), 10.12.070, 10.12.090, 10.12.100, 10.12.130, **10.12.290**, or 10.16.010 of this chapter shall be subject to civil penalties, fees, or charges and procedures as set forth in the resolution adopted by the board of supervisors pursuant to Section 10.12.190 of this article.

B. Civil Penalties. Notwithstanding subsection A of this section, any violation of Section 10.12.120 or 10.12.290 shall be punishable by a fine of one hundred dollars (\$100.00).

SECTION 5. Placer County Code Chapter 10, Article 10.12, Part 9, "Parking Restrictions on County Properties" is hereby added as follows:

Part 9. Parking Restrictions on County Properties.

10.12.290. Limitations imposed

A. Parking is prohibited between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. on county properties identified by the board of supervisors by resolution. The board of supervisors may update the list of county properties by resolution as needed.

- 1. County-owned vehicles are exempt from this provision.**
- 2. Emergency vehicles as defined in Vehicle Code section 165 are exempt from this provision.**

B. The director of facilities management, or designee, may issue overnight parking permits to county employees or contractors. The permit must be fully displayed on the vehicle dashboard or rear-view mirror while parked overnight on county property. All permits must indicate the expiration date.

C. The director of health and human services, or designee, may issue overnight parking permits to county employees or contractors and may issue overnight permits to clients participating in overnight programs or services. The permit must be fully displayed on the vehicle dashboard or rear-view mirror while parked overnight at the above properties. All permits must indicate the expiration date.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force thirty (30) days after the date of its passage. The Clerk is directed to publish this ordinance, or a summary thereof, within fifteen (15) days in accordance with Government Code section 25124.
