SUBJECT: Placer County FY 2020-21 RMRA Chip Seal Project / Western Placer County - Various Locations; Contract No. 001267, PJ01296

ACTION REQUESTED

Approve project specifications for the FY 2020-21 Road Maintenance Rehabilitation Account Chip Seal Project, Contract No. 001267, estimated to cost \$1,250,000 and authorize the Director of Public Works, or designee, to advertise for bids.

Approve and authorize the Director of Public Works, or designee, to execute agreements with the Town of Loomis and City of Auburn to include road projects for those municipalities in a joint bid with the County for chip sealing.

BACKGROUND

The Department of Public Works performs various surface treatments on County maintained roadways to protect, preserve, and extend their useful lives. Chip sealing provides a new wearing surface, some crack filling, and weather proofing. On rural roads chip sealing is the most cost-effective method to maintain and extend the life of these roads. Many older County roads were never constructed with a structural section; they were dirt farm roads that have only ever been chip sealed. The selection of roads for surface treatment is typically a function of the road condition, traffic volumes, and available funding. There are approximately 36 miles of roadway in this year's chip seal project.

Your Board's approval of the Department's FY 2020-21 Final Budget included funds for a chip seal project (PJ01296) for a total budgeted cost of \$1,250,000 funded by the Road Maintenance and Rehabilitation Account (RMRA) gas tax funds. Project bid books and specifications are on file with the Clerk of the Board. Roads to be treated may change depending on bid prices, which are subject to the volatility of the current oil market. The estimated completion date is summer/fall of 2021.

The Town of Loomis and City of Auburn are planning to conduct this chip seal resurfacing on one or more roads within their jurisdictions. To be efficient, County staff recommends allowing those projects to be included in the bid documents for the County's chip seal project. The Town of Loomis and City of Auburn would ultimately be responsible for contracting with the proposer who is recommended for award; the County would not execute, oversee, or be responsible for the resurfacing projects in those jurisdictions.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

This project is Categorically Exempt from the provisions of CEQA as a Class I exemption, Section 15301(c) (Maintenance of Existing Facilities).

FISCAL IMPACT

The total cost of the project is \$1,250,000 and is available in the Department of Public Works FY 2020-21 Final Budget, Engineering Division, CC19006, PJ01296. This is a one-time project that is a part of the Department's road maintenance and resurfacing efforts.

Re: Memorandum of Understanding – 2021 Road Resurfacing Joint Bid

Dear ,

We appreciate the City of Auburn's ("CITY") interest in partnering with Placer County ("COUNTY") on the County's 2021 Roadway Resurfacing Projects. The COUNTY is able to include the CITY'S road resurfacing project in a joint bid, pursuant to the following conditions.

1. The CITY roadway resurfacing project will be included in construction bid documents, along with the COUNTY roadway resurfacing project and possibly a roadway resurfacing project in the Town of Loomis.
2. The CITY is responsible for providing accurate data to COUNTY for inclusion in the bid documents, including the total distance of roadways to be resurfaced, material needed, maps, a sample contract, and accurate pricing and cost data. All data must be provided to the COUNTY by end of day on [DATE].
3. The COUNTY is responsible for the bid process, including publishing the bid, opening and reviewing bids, and selecting a bidder. The COUNTY will recommend an award to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder based on a proposal that includes all projects.
4. The CITY will be responsible for determining whether to execute a contract for its project, including any legislative action to authorize such award.
5. The CITY is responsible for all aspects of the project beyond the bidding process, including contract award, contract administration, construction management, and project supervision.
6. Neither CITY, nor any officer, employee, or volunteer thereof is responsible for any damage or liability occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by COUNTY under or in connection with any work, authority, or jurisdiction delegated to COUNTY under this agreement. It is understood and agreed that, pursuant to Government Code section 895.4, COUNTY shall fully defend, indemnify, and save harmless CITY, its officers, employees, and volunteers from all claims, suits, or actions of every nature, kind, and description brought for or on account of injury (as defined in Government Code section 810.8) occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by COUNTY under or in connection with any work, activity, or jurisdiction delegated to County under this agreement.
7. Neither COUNTY, nor any officer, employee, or volunteer thereof is responsible for any damage or liability occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by CITY under or in connection with any work, authority, or jurisdiction delegated to CITY under this agreement. It is understood and agreed that, pursuant to Government Code section 895.4, CITY shall fully defend, indemnify, and save harmless COUNTY, its officers, employees, and volunteers from all claims, suits, or actions of every nature, kind, and description brought for or on account of injury (as defined in

Government Code section 810.8) occurring by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by CITY under or in connection with any work, activity, or jurisdiction delegated to County under this agreement.

8. This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") shall be in effect until the completion of the COUNTY and CITY road resurfacing projects included in the joint bid.
9. This MOU represents the entire agreement between COUNTY and CITY with respect to the subject matter herein. This MOU may be amended at any time only by mutual written agreement of both parties.
